BRING JAP LABOR FOR RAILROAD
Commissioner of Immigration Says Large Numbers Are Taken to Hawaii, Thence to Northwestern States.
Many Devices Employed by Chinese to Evade Exclusion Law—They Also Aid Importation of Immoral Women

WASHINGTON, Monday, Jan. 7.—The fiscal year ended June 30, 1906, produced a record outpouring of former figures of the United States, according to the annual report of Frank Sargent, commissioner general of immigration. In that period, the report says, the population of the United States was increased by the admission of 1,190,725 immigrant aliens and 85,618 non-immigrant aliens entered at its ports, making a total admission of 1,276,343. The increase over last year's record of 1,059,756 was 166,587.
In the fiscal year 1905 the department rejected 450 alien applicants in the fiscal year 1906 the immigrant aliens that is, those who intended settling in the United States, were 12,432.
"Without exception," the report says, "the countries from which we obtained the greater number of immigrants are those which are inhabited by races akin to our own and have supplied us with smaller numbers during the past year than 1905—Ireland, 17,969; England, 16,218; Sweden, 2,281; Germany, 3,010; Denmark, 2,292, and Canada, 1,818. On the other hand, the four most considerable gains are: Italy, 51,541; Russia, 30,789; Greece, 8,974; and Turkey, 8,574."
The immigration from Austria-Hungary amounted to 25,135; from Belgium, 25,131; from Russia and Finland, 215,655; China, 1,544; Japan, 12,835; and the West Indies, 15,666.
The immigration from Southern and Eastern European countries, the commissioner says, is a result of general unrest existing among the laboring classes. The commissioner says drastic measures are required to effect a discontinuance of these steamship practices.
"That the physical and mental quality of the immigrants from these countries is much below those coming in former years, he says, is evident. The North Atlantic and North Central States together received 50 per cent of the entire immigration of 1906, the South 4 per cent."
Japs First Go to Hawaii.
The report refers to what the commissioner believes to have been extensive schemes for labor agents, who brought to light in the past year and now being investigated. The evidence is that the agents are admitted to show that some individual or corporation is engaged in importing numbers of Japanese laborers to work on the railroads of the Northwest.
These Japanese come to Hawaii desiring to "hot" labor agents, and claim that they are merely seeking labor that may be secured in the islands. They are admitted to the islands, and after remaining a few days or weeks there, they ship for Northwestern mainland ports at the Hawaiian ports, their voyage thence is to the mainland ports and they are then on their way to the mainland ports under the alien labor contract or any other provision of the immigration laws. The immigration direct to San Francisco dropped during the year to very small figures, and the report says that the cause similar to those just referred to.
The immigration commissioner at San Francisco reports that Japanese have been arriving there coastwise from Honolulu in the past year, and that the rate of from 1,000 to 3,000 per month.
The report says that several thousand laborers have been imported under this evasion of the law is not doubted. Recommendations, Ellis Island, according to the report, are entirely inadequate for the inspection work.
Eviction of Chinese Exclusion Law.
The Chinese exclusion law and its amendments are being investigated by stationing officers in China to investigate and approve certificates issued by the Chinese government to members of the exempt classes, such plan to supersede that of having the investigation made by the President's agents.
Improved conditions resulted from the President's orders of last spring in the shooting of Mrs. Martin and Miss Helms after his discharge.
Various methods are pointed out in the report by which Chinese are endeavoring to enter the country in violation of the law under the guise of domiciled merchants, and other means of evasion. The commissioner says that the registration of all Chinese in the United States is again recommended. Any Chinese laborer found in the United States a year after the registration not who has not a residence certificate and is found to be unlicensed here should, the report says, be deported.
The commissioner reports that on the Mexican border Chinese coolies are being smuggled into this country from Mexico.
The commissioner again recommends increased penalties on steamship companies for bringing aliens afflicted with dangerous or loathsome diseases. The President's suggestion of exempting the Mexican border to all aliens except citizens of Mexico is also urged.
In the year the report says, the "white slave" traffic was extensively revived. Many of the girls and women imported from Europe and Asia were brought through Mexico and obtained a right to citizenship by marrying Chinese born in this country.

DOMESTIC STRIFE CAUSES TRAGEDY
Frederick B. Martin Wounds His Wife, Kills His Sister-in-Law and Then Shoots Himself With Revolver.
Couple Had Lived Unhappily, After Which Husband Went Away for While and Returned Home Unexpectedly.

PORTLAND, Ore., Monday, Jan. 7.—Frederick B. Martin, until recently city salesman of the Portland branch of the Pacific Electric Company, yesterday shot and slightly wounded his wife, and killed his sister-in-law, Miss Emma Helms, his sister-in-law, and then sent a bullet into his own head.
Family troubles are alleged to have been the cause of the deed. The tragedy took place at "The Ella," a fashionable boarding house on the corner of Ella and Washington streets, of which Mrs. Martin is the manager. According to reports at the house, the married life of the couple had been stormy at times but they did not separate until Martin's discharge from the biscuit company a few months ago and his sudden departure for California after his discharge.
Recently he returned to Portland and his wife refused to live with him. This refusal Martin attributed to the interference of Miss Helms. Martin went to the Ella yesterday afternoon and gained admission to the place unknown to Mrs. Martin. He entered his wife's apartment and a few minutes later the shooting of Mrs. Martin and Miss Helms occurred.
Martin then went to the basement where he turned his revolver upon himself. What happened here, who the slayer is not yet known. Mrs. Martin, who is the only one who knows his suffering, says that she saw her husband with both Martin and his wife are well known in Southern Oregon. Mrs. Martin's father having been a wealthy pioneer of Jacksonville.
Martin's family came from Ashland, Oregon. His brother-in-law is the son of Max Pracht, a politician well known in this coast and at present connected with the Interior Department at Washington.

AUTOS FOR MAIL COLLECTION
Report of Assistant Postmaster-General Hitchcock Declares That Motor Vehicles Give Speedier Service.
Increased Pay for Clerks and Abandonment of Back Cancellation Are Changes Recommended for Department.
By Associated Press, Special by Leased Wire.
WASHINGTON, Monday, Jan. 7.—A proposal to increase postal clerks' salaries and the proposed abandonment of the "back stamp" on letters, are discussed by First Assistant Postmaster-General Hitchcock in his annual report just made public.
At the close of the fiscal year 65,600 postoffices were in operation and that the total number of employees, not including postmasters and assistant postmasters, was nearly 150,000. The total personnel of postoffices in the United States, including the gain in the present fiscal year this far indicated that the unappropriated gain in the department is \$2,110,000. The additional appropriations requested of Congress scarcely will be sufficient to maintain the service in the present state.
Hitchcock reports that the use of specially equipped automobiles in the collection service in Baltimore has proved so successful that the department now is planning for a similar collection service in several other cities.
"It is believed that in large cities automobiles can be substituted advantageously for the horse carts now employed so generally in collecting mail," he reports.
"By the use of automobile vehicles, a much speedier collection service can be maintained, and the cost of the service will be reduced. It is unquestionably an important factor in the postal service, and ready to be in other business enterprises."
Hitchcock says while the gross receipts of city delivery offices are 4 per cent greater than in the preceding year the cost of the service was but 4.7 per cent more than in 1905, the average per cent of the cost of service to gross receipts being only 18.19, as against 1905 in 1905.
