The V for Victory joined the Cross for Calvary in the meditation of worshippers, as the war became the subject of prayers and sermons throughout the city.

Easter white replaced Lenten purple in Catholic, Episcopal and Lutheran churches, where tapers burned and flowers bloomed on altars.

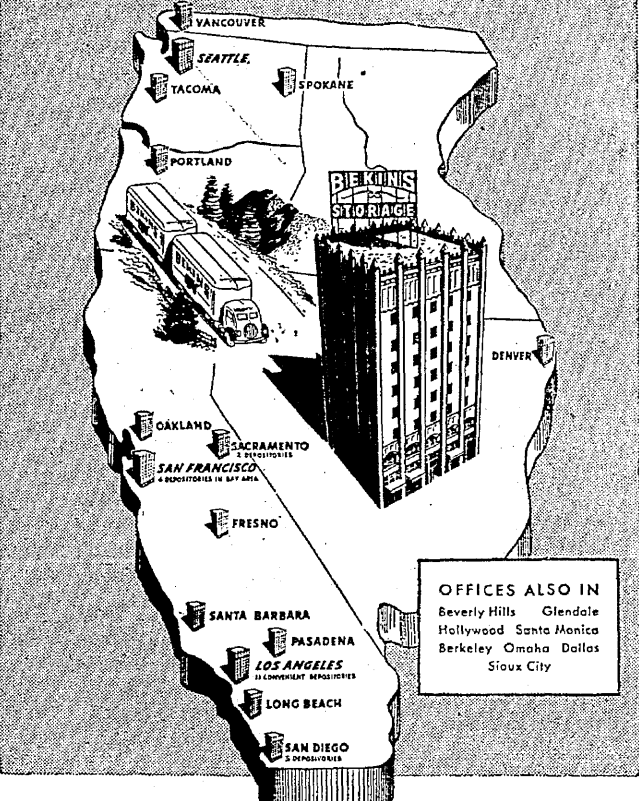
