Coast Guard headquarters in Seattle yesterday announced new fishing regulations for fishing vessels operating off the coasts of Washington and Oregon.

The same restrictions will apply to pleasure boats and other small craft. Fishing vessels entering the Strait of Juan de Fuca from seaward are required to enter Neah Bay and report to the Coast Guard Section Base for examination.

Identification signals to cover the passage in the strait will be given at Neah Bay for inbound vessels from the Strait of Juan de Fuca.

LABOR, CAPITAL MEETING CALLED

WASHINGTON, April 25.—(UP)—The War Production Board's shipbuilding stabilization committee called a meeting of labor and management in the shipbuilding industry to meet Monday in Chicago to take up a labor problem.

All shipbuilders constructing or repairing naval or Maritime Commission vessels will be required to sign as well as American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations unions engaged in the industry.

Old-Time Skippers Now Have New Duties to Perform

Puget Sound pilots, some of them with half a century of colorful deep-sea service behind them, have new and important duties to perform as a result of the war emergency.

Instead of serving ship owners and operators exclusively, they also receive orders from the Army and the Navy for the movement of ships, many of which are laden with war cargoes.

Capt. L. B. (Ben) Lovejoy, who has been a deep-sea pilot on Puget Sound the past 25 years, and another veteran pilot, Capt. A. S. Howell, were among the group of old-time skippers who met at the pilot headquarters in Seattle yesterday.

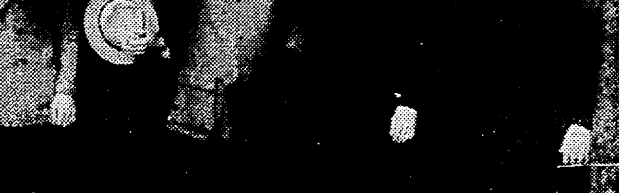

\$44,945 LIEN ON DUTCH SHIP O. K' D
