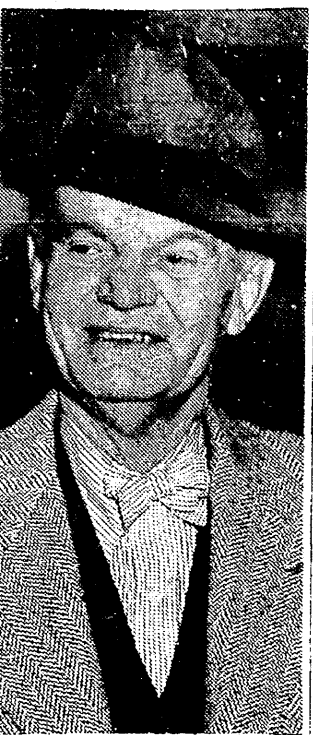


NATIONAL W. P. A. HEAD RESIGNS

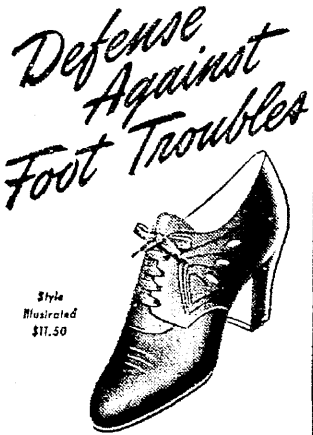
G. O. P. to Elect Majority In House, Kelland Predicts

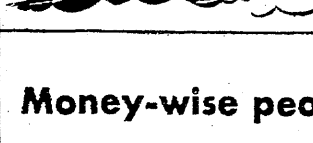

RENTAL RULINGS AWAITED HERE

Seattle landlords, tenants and the Fair Rent Committee of the Civilian War Commission today awaited arrival of John A. Bohn, assistant to Leon Henderson, director of the Office of Price Administration, for information on rent schedules in the Puget Sound area.

Last March 2, O. P. A. ordered rents in the area returned to schedules of April 1, 1941, and granted a 60-day period in which to effect the change.

The Fair Rent Committee has been holding hearings for landlords and tenants and calling for voluntary rent schedules and will present findings to Bohn. The proposed schedules, however, are above the rents of April 1, 1941, in most instances.

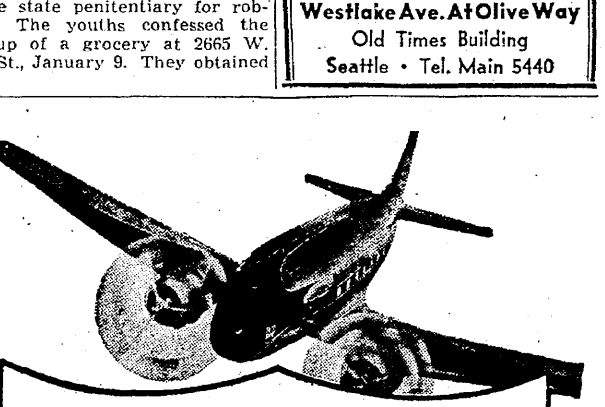
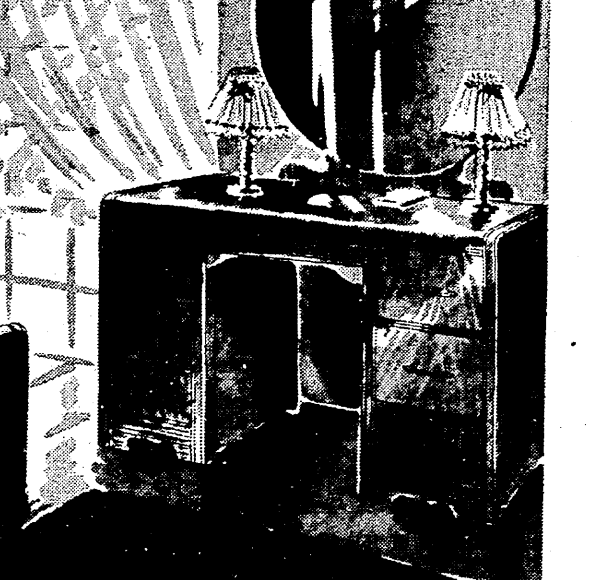
