64,000 Rail Workers Win Wage Increase

NEW YORK, April 29.—(AP)—An increase to a 40-cent-an-hour minimum wage level for some 64,000 employees of trunkline and shortline railroads was recommended today by a joint wage committee operating under sponsorship of the United States Labor Department Wage and Hour Division.

Hamley Going to Capital

C., to attend a conference called by President Roosevelt to iron out interstate trade barriers hampering the war effort. The conference of state and federal agencies will be held May 5 to 7. Carl C. Swedish See Raiders

Swedish newspaper reports describe Monday night raid on Trondheim as extremely heavy, saying bombers came over for three hours, their flares and engine exhausts being visible at the Swedish frontier. They said one British plane landed 25 miles from the border and its crew was being hunted by the Nazis.

Norwegians in London reported that a number of large submarines had joined the surface craft and that thousands of Norwegian and Danish laborers were working under German armed guards to convert Trondheim into a fortified naval base.

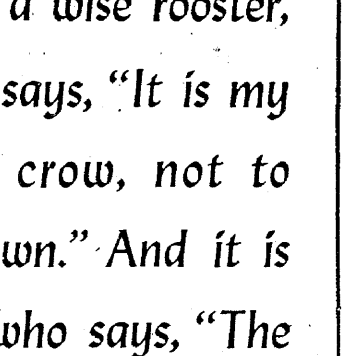
'When the Prinz Eugen and the Tirpitz arrived, large numbers of German wounded were brought ashore and sent to German hospitals,' it was said.

CZECHS RESIST CALL; 25 HANGED

LONDON, April 29.—(AP)—Czecho-Slovak sources in London said today 25 persons were hanged in the main square at Tetschen and six others were executed at Bohumín after riots which followed when the Germans summoned additional Czechs to the colors. They said 70,000 Czechs who nominally became Germans under the Munich settlement had been forced into the German army.

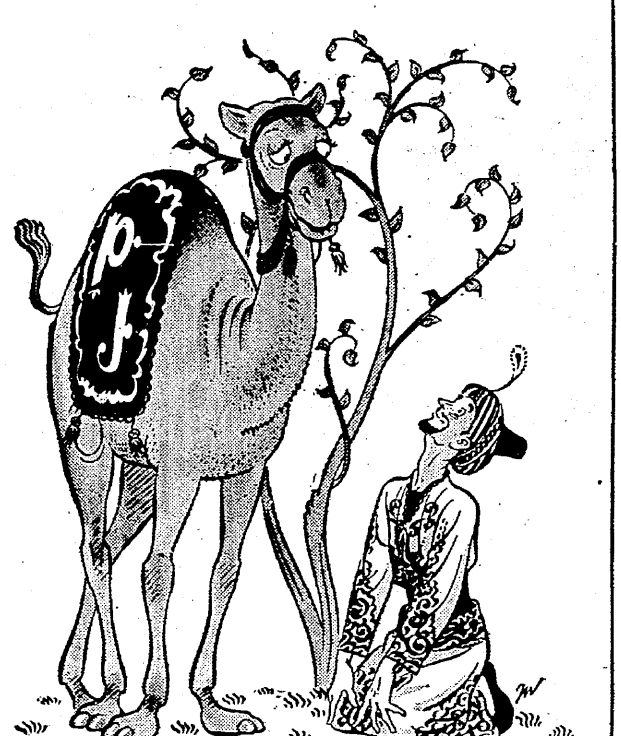

For an encore he selected his arrangement of Vera-cini's 'Largo.' His accompanist was Martin Kuppner-Sten.
R. H. Kendrick, founder of the Philomel Singers, directed the group.
