FAR EASTERN FRONT UNITED STATES

NEW DELHI, May 5.—(AP)—A United States air headquarters communique today said: "A successful attack was made by bombers of the United States Army Air Force on Mingaladon Airfield last night. A number of heavy bombs were dropped. Hits were scored on runways and buildings. Large explosions were seen. Fires started at a hangar were seen to be burning fiercely, the fires being visible 60 miles away."

ON BURMA ROAD

Chinese sources today reported that Japanese forces had driven up the Burma Road and crossed the Chinese border (1) and that fighting raged around Wanting, which still was in Chinese hands. Farther up the road Yungchang was left aflame after a Japanese raid, Tokyo said. The Japanese also had driven north from Mandalay, apparently heading (broken arrow) for Bhamo (2) to seal the alternate Burma Road terminus.
