He was treated at the hospital and sent home.

Driver of the car was Henry E. Elker, Jr., 9245 17th Ave. S. W. Police said both boys were riding on one bicycle.

### Narcotics-Act Registrations Are Due July 1

Approximately 3,000 persons in Washington and Alaska required by law to register under the Harrison Narcotics Act will be mailed re-registration applications May 25, Clark Squire, collector of internal revenue, announced here today.

Squire cautioned all importers, manufacturers, producers, compounders, dealers and dispensers that applications must be in the collector's office in Tacoma by July 1.

He said that each year many persons, including many doctors, fail to submit their applications on time. They thereby subject themselves to strict penalties.

### TARDY REGISTER FOR SUGAR NOW

Local rationing boards for the first time today began registering persons who have been compelled to do without sugar because they failed to register earlier this month for rationing cards at elementary schools. It is estimated 85,000 persons failed to register.

Rationing officials emphasized that the new registration is taking place at rationing-board offices rather than at elementary schools, where the first registration took place.

The schools, it was pointed out, are making preparations for gasoline-rationing registration next Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

No 'Gas' Limits Now

Floris A. Nagelvoort, state rationing administrator, announced that motorists may fill their tanks until rationing goes into effect June 2, sales being curtailed only by dealers' supplies. It was pointed out that out-of-state tourists in either Washington or Oregon must register the same as state residents in order to obtain enough fuel to get home.

Seattle motorists out of Washington during next week's registration will be able to register any time in June at any Washington rationing board.

Automobile owners will register Thursday and Friday from 2:30 o'clock to 9 o'clock in Seattle and from 2 o'clock to 9 o'clock in King County outside Seattle. Hours Saturday will be from 10 o'clock in the morning to 6 o'clock at night in Seattle, and from 9 o'clock in the morning to 6 o'clock at night outside the city.

Schools to Register

Elementary schools, the same as for sugar board, will be the registration points throughout the county, with the exception of Summit School. Those near this site will register for gasoline either at Broadway High School or the Automobile Club of Washington offices, 1109 Pine St.

Officials pointed out that local rationing boards are the same for tires, automobiles, sugar and gasoline, but said they are receiving thousands of calls from persons who do not have the addresses.

Effects Already Felt

The rationing program, meanwhile, began to affect civilian life even before it became effective.

Walter Welke, chairman of the National School of Music Competition Festival, to be held during the week-end on the University of Washington campus, announced curtailment of participation in the fifth annual session due to shortage of tires and gasoline.

Welke said the festival this year will be divided into three sections, and high schools outside the Seattle district will be judged in Tacoma and Aberdeen, the judges instead of contestants doing the traveling.

The festival originally was scheduled for all day Friday and Saturday, but the Friday evening and Saturday-afternoon sessions have been canceled.

Ad Campaign Deferred

The Washington State Progress Commission in Olympia announced that because of gasoline rationing the tourist advertising program has been "deferred," the Associated Press reported.

Lieut. Col. Edward Osburn, commanding the 3rd Battalion, Home Defense Infantry Regiment, said his men will serve as auxiliary police group during the gasoline-registration period next week.

### FARM BUILDING CURBED BY U. S.

Farm construction exceeding \$1,000 in any one year, "off-farm" construction exceeding \$5,000, or farm-residence construction exceeding \$300 now requires a War Production Board project rating, Verne Pickering, chairman of the King County United States Department of Agriculture War Board, announced today.

The W. P. B. has ordered restrictions on sale of scarce materials for residence or other construction not essential to the war program.

### Steps Taken to End Farm Labor Shortage

The King County United States Department of Agriculture War Board is cooperating with the United States Employment Service to solve a serious labor shortage which threatens King County crops, County Agent A. E. Lovett said today.

Lovett said all available labor must be used with greatest efficiency. Farmers may help by anticipating their labor needs and keeping the employment service fully informed in advance.

### TWO KILLED AS BUS, CAR CRASH

AMARILLO, Tex., May 21.—(AP)—Two persons burned to death and ten occupants of a bus were injured today in the crash and burning of the bus and an automobile east of Claude, Tex.
