

### Sentence Too Short, Convicted Jap Tells Court

The high light of an unusual jury trial was reached late yesterday when Gordon Kyoshi Hirabayashi, convicted Tuesday of disobeying both Japanese evacuation and curfew laws last spring, was dissatisfied with United States District Judge Lloyd L. Black's sentence because the sentence was too short. Judge Black first sentenced the 24-year-old University of Washington senior to 30 days on each of two counts, to be served consecutively, with the King County Jail recommended. The sentence was changed on appeal from the defendant, to the three months on each count, to be

served concurrently, with the federal prison-camp at Dupont recommended. This changed the term from 60 to 90 days. The change to a longer sentence was asked because Hirabayashi and his counsel, Frank Walters, hope to appeal the case to the United States Circuit Court of Appeals and the shorter sentence gives them little or no opportunity. Until the appeal is made and a decision is handed down, Hirabayashi, in either case, will have to stay in jail where he has spent the past five months. With the shorter

sentence, the 60 days probably would expire before the appeal could be made and a decision handed down, and then the appellate court might feel the defendant had nothing from which to appeal. "I can't help thinking of the men who have gone into the service willingly because it is the law of the land," J. Charles Dennis, United States attorney, told the court. "We are not asking Hirabayashi to enter the armed forces but to leave a certain jurisdiction. This is the only instance a Japanese in Seattle has endeavored in any way to block evacuation."

### Fort Seeks Women To Operate Laundry

TACOMA, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Nearby Fort Lewis issued an urgent plea yesterday for an additional 300 women workers in the Army Camp's million-dollar, ultra-modern laundry. The Army also announced that new pay raises would go into effect immediately, bringing the pay scale up to \$136 per month for women checkers, markers, sorters and distributors. The Fort plant, spreading out over nearly 10 acres, is operated with the latest model equipment.

### Mary Pickford Rests Easy After Operation

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Mary Pickford, actress, today apparently was making a normal recovery from a kidney operation performed at St. Vincent's Hospital yesterday. Attendants said she was resting easily, and earlier her husband, Lieut. Charles Rogers, former band leader, declared: "Everything is fine; the operation was very successful."

### W. P. B. Reduces Production Of Farm Machines


WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Farm-tractor production will be reduced almost 80 per cent in 1943, under a War Production Board order allocating critical materials for manufacture of agricultural machinery. Quotas for new machinery will be apportioned among certain manufacturers. Combined, they will be equivalent to about 23 per cent of the total amount manufactured in 1940. Quotas for repair parts will be equivalent to about 130 per cent of 1940 production. Agriculture Department officials

said the W. P. B. quotas would reduce tractor manufacture from about 170,000 in 1942 to 37,000 in 1943. Next year's quotas and comparable 1942 figures, respectively, for other important farm machinery items include: Corn planters (two-row, horse-drawn), 4,680 in 1943, and 18,000 in 1942; peanut pickers, 800 and 3,600; combines (six-foot and under), 17,000 and 35,000; corn pickers, 5,000 and 15,000; grain drills, 6,700 and 26,000; two-horse walking plows, 5,527 and 37,000; two-

bottom tractor plows, 36,200 and 68,000; disc harrows, 30,000 and 78,000; cultivators (one-row, two-horse), 3,300 and 15,000; grain binders, 2,000 and 10,650; mowing machines, 14,000 and 45,000; hay binders, 10,000 and 19,600; milking machines, 50,000 and 66,438; incubators, 2,500 and 3,200.
