

TRUCKS TO NEED CERTIFICATES

The Office of Defense Transportation again warned owners and operators of commercial vehicles today that they positively must obtain "certificates of war necessity" by November 15, or they will be unable to buy gasoline.

Application forms for the certificates have been or will be sent to owners of trucks, taxicabs and all other commercial vehicles. Owners then must fill out the forms, send them to the O. D. T. in Detroit and get their certificates by November 15.

Mrs. Roosevelt In Britain on Visit

two or three weeks and inspect every phase of the British war effort she can in that limited time.

The announcement from the royal palace said: "Mrs. Roosevelt has arrived in this country at the invitation of the King and Queen in order to gain first-hand knowledge of British women's war activities and to visit the United States forces in Great Britain."

"Mrs. Roosevelt, accompanied by Miss Malvina Thompson, will be the guest of the King and Queen during the first part of her visit."

Mrs. Roosevelt, no doubt, will see Prime Minister and Mrs. Churchill and other important personalities as well as the Royal Family.

Included so far on her itinerary are visits to the Women's Auxiliary Air Force, the Auxiliary Territorial Service and the Women's Royal Naval Service.

She also is expected to view the civil-defense system and women at work in industry.

Winant on Hand
When Mrs. Roosevelt reached the station at 4:30 p. m. (8:30 a. m., Seattle War Time) she was greeted on the platform beside the train by United States Ambassador John G. Winant and members of the British cabinet.

Although the date and place of Mrs. Roosevelt's arrival had not been announced, the advance preparations, including decoration of the platform with the Stars and Stripes and the Union Jack, had attracted a sizable crowd to the station.

For several blocks around policemen were posted at every street corner and inside the station on-lookers, including many American soldiers, were held back by wooden barriers.

At the point where the First Lady stepped from her car, a red carpet had been laid out, surrounded by a wooden fence draped with the British flag.

King in R. A. F. Uniform
Mrs. Roosevelt stepped from the train wearing a long black coat trimmed with blue fox and a cherry-red hat trimmed with green feathers.

King, George, wearing the uniform of a marshal of the Royal Air Force, was the first to greet her. He shook hands, followed by the Queen, and the three stood chatting and smiling for a while.

The King introduced Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden to the American First Lady.

The train arrived a minute ahead of time. The platform interviews took less than five minutes and then, with the big crowd cheering, Mrs. Roosevelt drove off with the King and Queen.

Allan Pomerooy, assistant United States attorney, agreed to the dismissal order upon stipulation that Sugiura would stay in the relocation camp in Idaho and not return to the coast military area. Sugiura failed to be evacuated with his Seattle family, pleading innocent to charges on the grounds his mother is a Caucasian and he did not know he was violating the law by remaining in Seattle.

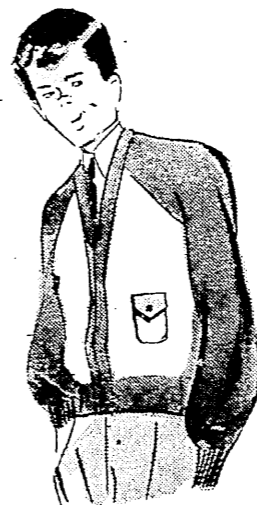

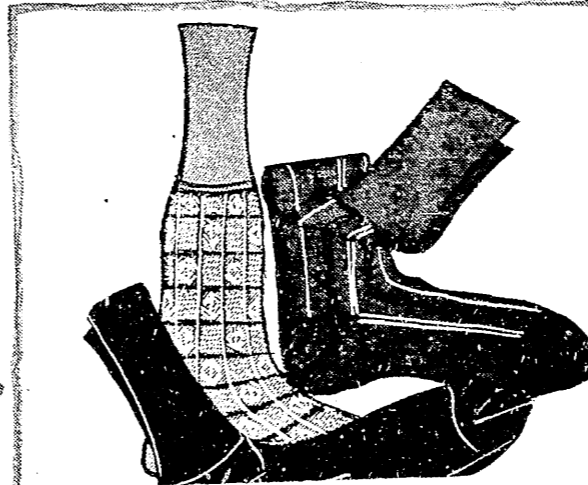

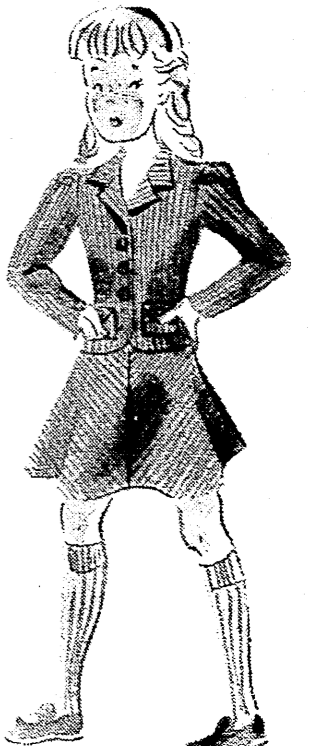
