REDRESS DRIVE UNDERWAY

An action network has been formed in fund raising and information. A committee made up of Sue Nakagawa, Amy Furumasu, Ada Honda, Fumi Uyeji, Michi Sakai, Sumi Okamoto, Janet Tamura, Marcelline Burdett, Hida Yonago, Kaz Yamamoto, Glo Ota and Ayako Tanaka has been formed to contact community members for phone calling and letter writing.

A fund-raising committee meeting was convened on May 21 to discuss ways and means to raise monies for the lobbying effort the next 3 years. The committee of Ed Tsutakawa, Everett Matsui, Mason Fukai, Sam Nakagawa, Denny Yasuhara, Harry Kadoya, Dr. Jim Watanabe, Dean Nakagawa, Roy Soejima and Harry Kadoya will meet again on June 4, 1984, to finalize efforts and the method to raise needed funds.

Why do we need these monies?... 218 votes in the House and 51 votes in the Senate are needed for passage of the redress bill. In the Pacific Northwest District we have 14 Congressmen and 6 Senators for 10 JACL chapters to cover. In the Midwest District there are 103 Congressmen and 16 Senators and the Eastern District - 114 Congressmen and 24 Senators. Combined, they have only 14 chapters to cover the entire

With Representative Stephen Solarz (D-N.Y.) signing on as a co-sponsor to HR 442 on 28 February 1986, the count now stands at 121 in the House. Senator Alan J. Dixon (D-Illinois) also became a co-sponsor on 22 January to bring the number of co-sponsors in the Senate to 29.

Grant Ujifusa informed Denny Yasuhara last week that two more members of the House subcommittee indicated support for the bill. Thus, the possibility of getting the bills reported out of the committees to the full House for a vote looks more promising.

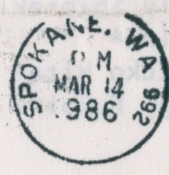

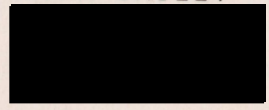
