Dear Mr. Clattenburg:

For your information and the completion of your Japanese records, this is to advise that the three following-named Japanese aliens departed for Japan from the port of San Francisco, California, aboard the SS "General Meigs" on March 14, 1947.

- ✓ **EHICHI ADA** - Former alien enemy case who had been confined in the U. S. Public Health Service Hospital at Lexington, Kentucky, immediately prior to his return to Japan.
- ✓ **KUNIJJI ONO** - Former alien enemy case who had been confined in the U. S. Public Health Service Hospital at Lexington, Kentucky, immediately prior to his return to Japan.
- ✓ **TOKUMATSU SOGAWA** - A 62-year old native and citizen of Japan who has never been in the custody of this Service either in immigration or alien enemy proceedings. Claims birth in the City of Wakayama-ken, County of Kaiso-gun, Kimoto-mura, Japan, on March 15, 1885 and last entered the United States at Seattle, Washington, in October of 1919. Being without a job and on public assistance, being 90% blind and desirous of rejoining his wife, Sugino Sogawa, and son, Tokuichi (alleged to be residing in the alien's birthplace in Japan) he requested that he be returned to Japan pursuant to the provisions of Section 23 of the Act of February 5, 1917, as amended. His request having been approved, it was ordered that he be removed to Japan, his native country, at government expense in accordance with the provisions of the law mentioned.
