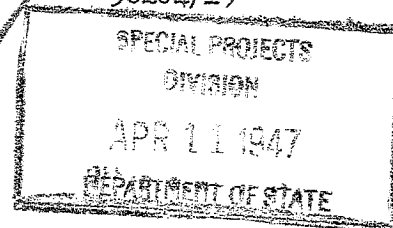

Dear Mr. Clattenburg:

For your information and the completion of your Japanese records, this is to advise that the thirteen following-named Japanese aliens departed for Japan from the Port of San Francisco, California, aboard the steamship "General Gordon" on March 28, 1947:

SHICHITARO KURATA ^{cc} or MURAKAMI, KIYOSHI

For personal data relating to this alien, see this office's letter of February 17, 1947, to your Visa Division requesting a military permit.

MASAYOSHI FURUYA ^{cc} or SEIJI KOTANI or ISAMU WATANABE

For personal data relating to this alien, see this office's letter of February 20, 1947, to your Visa Division requesting a military permit.

CHIKAHARU NAGAOKO ^{cc} alias SHINJI NAGAOKA alias JIMMY YOSNIHARA

For personal data relating to this alien, see this office's letter of February 17, 1947, to your Visa Division requesting a military permit.

ROKUSABURO NOYA ^{cc} alias ROKUSABURO NAYA

For personal data relating to this alien, see this office's letter of February 18, 1947, to your Visa Division requesting a military permit.

BENJIRO TANIGUCHI

For personal data relating to this alien, see application for exit permit submitted by the alien to your Department as mentioned in this office's letter of February 20, 1947.

KUMATARO SEO

For personal data relating to this alien, see his application for permission to depart from the United States (Form AD-1) submitted to your Department by him on February 4, 1947, and bearing number 24156.

IMAXI IMAYA alias HIDETAKA HAYASHI

For personal data relating to this alien, see this office's letter of January 23, 1947, to your Visa Division requesting a military permit.

KEN SUGIYAMA alias KEN RINDA

Native and subject of Japan, single, male, born August 26, 1905, in Yokohama, Japan (in this connection, has testified that although he was born in Yokohama, when he moved to Tokyo he became a citizen of Tokyo and the birth records were transferred from Yokohama to Tokyo); parents were Seizaburo Sugiyama, his father, who was employed as a bond and stockbroker on the stock exchange in Japan and mother, Kow (maiden name unknown), both born in Japan and last known by the subject to be residing in Tokyo. Also has four sisters, Ayako, Masako, Kimiko and Fusako, all born in Japan and living in Tokyo, present street address not known by the subject. Entered the United States on August 10, 1934, and has been in this country since then, former resident of Tule Lake Relocation Center. Ordered deported to Japan on March 20, 1946.

TERUO OZAKI alias HENRY TOMIZO OHARA

Personal data previously furnished in connection with his internment as an alien enemy. Was ordered deported to Japan June 6, 1946, immediately prior to deportation was employed on the Seabrook Farms, New Jersey, work project.

MINENORI AOYAMA alias MINENORI ASYAMA

Native and citizen of Japan, single, male, born October 17, 1901, in the town of Naze, province of Kagoshima, Japan; father's name, Naomine Aoyama, and mother's name, Haba Rata, both citizens of Japan and now deceased. He was their only child. He has been in the United States since February 11, 1925, when he entered at the Port of New York ex SS "Liverpool Maru" as a seaman. Ordered deported to Japan October 31,

1946, was employed as a cook and houseman by the Dr. Irving Goldman family at 1085 Park Avenue, New York City.

HATSUTARO ISHIGAKI ee

Native and citizen of Japan who has maintained a continuous residence in the United States since 1906. Born on December 12, Meiji 7, (1874), in Oaza Ida, Ida Mura, Minami Muro Gun, Mie Ken, Japan; was formerly a fisherman who has been unemployed since February 2, 1942, on which date he was taken into custody and interned and subsequently paroled; has been the recipient of relief from the Bureau of Public Assistance in Los Angeles, California, from November 9, 1945, to date of departure. In accordance with his formal request filed with this Service, he was ordered removed to Japan, his native country, at Government expense pursuant to the provisions of Section 23 of the Act of February 5, 1917, as amended.


RISA ISHIGAKI ee

Wife of the above, Hatsutaro Ishigaki, who was removed to Japan with him per her request, pursuant to provisions of Section 23 of the Act of 1917; stated at the time of her registration under the Alien Registration Act that she was born in Ida Mura, Minami Muro, Miye Ken, Japan, in December of 1876 (the day forgotten).
