Gentlemen:

Reference is made to letter from the Provost Marshal General's Office to your office dated 29 March 1945, inclosing copy of a letter of that date to the War Relocation Authority, concerning 25 civilians of Japanese ancestry from the Territory of Hawaii and 10 civilians of Japanese ancestry from the Territory of Alaska, whose return to those territories has been authorized by the War Department.

For your information, priorities have been granted with regard to the transportation of 10 of these individuals from Hawaii, who are listed below. It is anticipated that steps will be taken for their transportation to Hawaii within a reasonable time, and you will be informed of the action taken. The individuals concerned are as follows:

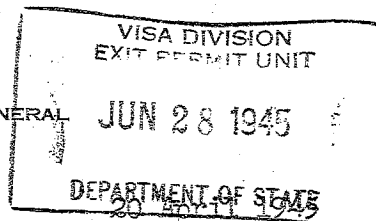

1. Reference is made to letters dated 14 August 1945 and 15 October 1945 from Military Intelligence Service to Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Middle Pacific, Subject: Japanese Repatriated from United States to Hawaii.

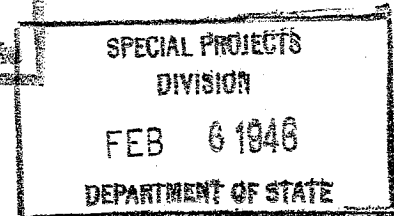
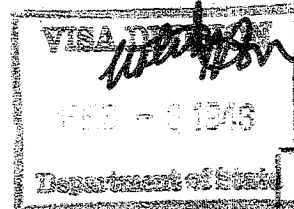

There are inclosed for your information lists of the individuals of Japanese ancestry who have been returned to Hawaii from the United States. The inclosures comprise photostatic copies of four passenger lists setting forth the names of persons who were included in the following three sailings: "S. S. Imperial," from Seattle, Washington on 4 July 1945; "S. S. Yarmouth," from Seattle, Washington on 7 November 1945, and "S. S. Shawnee," from Los Angeles, California on 4 December 1945. The total number of individuals named on these passenger lists is 1371. In addition, there is inclosed a list of 23 persons who were returned to Hawaii but are not included in the above-mentioned passenger lists.
