

Each of the persons listed below had an interest in the subject matter of this claim, and each has filed a claim, number as set forth opposite each respective name. Such interest arose out of the fact that legal title to all the property involved in this claim was in the name of Fujii Company, a California corporation. All of the stock was owned by five sisters and one brother and they operated a nursery business on that property, as a family operation. All members of the family were shareholders in the corporation and all participated in the business and profits as members of the family. The number of shares held by each member of the family and the percentage interest represented by such shares is set forth opposite each name as the same existed on December 7, 1941 and has continued, without change, ever since.

When evacuation became imminent, I advertised in the newspapers and told persons I knew, including a Mr. Sattui, that I wanted to make a lease of the nursery properties before our entire family was evacuated. About April 16 or 17, 1942, I received a letter dated April 16, 1942 from a Mr. A. Knott (EXHIBIT B-1) and I replied on April 19, 1942 (EXHIBIT B-2). Mr. Knott called in person at the nursery and we discussed the matter; he seemed to be the most likely and competent person who had shown any interest in the property. I made a written lease with him on May 1, 1942 (EXHIBIT B-3). This lease provided for his marketing all flowers grown on the property through E. W. McLellan Company, a wholesale florist in whom I had full confidence, and a written marketing agreement was entered into with McLellan Company on May 7, 1942 (EXHIBIT B-4).

These two agreements, the lease and the McLellan agreement were prepared by my attorney, Mr. Calden; his fee for his services was \$125.00 and that fee was paid in two checks (EXHIBITS) as follows:

Check Number 573, dated July 12, 1944 for \$25.00 and

Check Number 583, dated Jan. 27, 1945 for \$100.00.
