In answer to queries concerning the assistance of those wishing private employment, Frank P. Pagan, Placement officer, has the following to say:

"Hundreds of evacuees have taken the three copies of Form #126 from the Placement Office with intentions of making application for leave. Up to date many of the completed forms have not been returned.

"All applicants are urged to fill out the forms and take them to the Placement Office at once in order to avoid delay for final leave approval.

"This applies also to those who have no definite private employment in mind at the present but who have intentions of leaving the project later."

Pagan emphasized that after leave has been granted and position accepted, an evacuee may leave within a few days.
