

ALIENS MAY BE ACCEPTED IN U.S. ARMY

HUNT, IDAHO, Feb. 19--
The War Department has announced that an extension of its policy with regard to aliens is being seriously considered, Project Director Harry L. Stafford was quoted as saying in the Minidoka Irrigator.

He declared that the War Department group headed by Lt. Stanley D. Arnold now at that center has been advised that they may receive applications from non-citizens who desire to volunteer for induction into the U. S. Army.

Applications from the 17-35 age group are being taken to preclude the necessity of the War Department team's having to return at a future date and will be held pending final determination of the War Department's policy, the Irrigator disclosed.

TUESDAY: Males in Blocks 19, 54 and 73 and females in Blocks 22, 48, 56 and 69.
