Registration
Report Given

With four days remaining for registration, 1938 male citizens in the Project had completed their registration by Friday.

On the same day, 1838 females and 482 aliens had already registered, according to the figures released today.

At Heart Mountain, 1737 citizens and 2165 aliens had registered, while at Jerome, 4744 were reported already registered according to a teletype message received from Washington D.C.

RESETTLEMENT
FIELD OFFICE
IN OPERATION

New York--At the meeting of the Committee on resettlement of Japanese American, George E. Rundquist, executive secretary, reported on the latest developments and function of the new WRA field offices, according to the Resettlement Bulletin.

The function of field representatives of the WRA is to explore employment possibilities, assist the local civilian agencies, committees on resettlement, and forward job offers directly to Project Directors in the camps. It is understood that teletype service be installed between these points so that offers can be announced instantly.

The WRA now registers evacuees to whom leave clearance has been granted. Upon receipt of job offers from field representatives, Project Directors will interview candidates listed on the register and forward data to the office that made the referral. If conditions are satisfactory, both in regard to the employment and the candidate's qualifications and character, the Washington office will wire indefinite leave to Project Directors.

PROPERTY OFFICE WILL
BE ESTABLISHED HERE

To assist the evacuees in handling problems of management, operation and disposition of real and personal property or in settling claims held by them, a branch of the Evacuee Property Office will be established here, it was revealed in a letter to the Project Director from Russell T. Robinson, Chief of the WRA Property Office in San Francisco.

A representative from the San Francisco Office will be here to be a member of the Project staff.

The decision to have an Evacuee Property Office representative stationed here came as a result of the uncertainty in handling outside property matters.

It is to be distinctly understood, Mr. Robinson stated, that the Evacuee Property Office does not

direct what disposition should be made of any property or how it should be managed. Officials, however, will act as advisors when called upon to do so.

The office is not intended to take the place of any other proper agency such as banks, attorneys, real estate agents, but rather to provide an auxiliary service.

FUKUI TAKES POINT HONOR
