3 GRADE SCHOOLS TO REOPEN TUESDAY VOLUNTEERS MAKE RETURN OF TEACHERS POSSIBLE

The three elementary project schools will reopen at the usual time on Tuesday, Mar. 16, according to an announcement made by Kenneth M. Harkness, superintendent of schools.

Thirty registrars have volunteered to replace the grade school teachers at the registration halls. This makes it possible for all elementary teachers to resume their curricular activities, Mr. Harkness said.

The Rimrock, Washington, and Lincoln elementary schools closed Feb. 9, when the Army team began project-wide registration for selective service and mass clearance of evacuees for outside work.

The same hour schedules will be followed in the elementary schools, Mr. Harkness explained.
