16 YEAR OLDS MAY QUIT SCHOOL TO WORK

High school students, sixteen years of age or over, may discontinue school and accept full time employment with parent's consent. It was disclosed by Frank Fagan, Placement head. If students terminate in the middle of a school semester, they cannot return to school until the

beginning of the next semester.

He added that the arrangement is subject to cancellation, should the WRA policy change.

At the present, there are no openings for high school students, Frank Fagan added.

RED CROSS DRIVE IS SLATED FOR NEXT WEEK

GOAL IS \$1250; PROCEEDS WILL BE USED IN PROJECT

With the Project quota set at \$1250, the Tule Lake Project Unit of the American Red Cross will conduct an emergency fund drive next week from Monday, Mar. 29 to Saturday, Apr. 3.

The set quota will be used on the Project by the Red Cross organization to equip each block managers' office with first-aid kits, to conduct nutrition and Red Cross courses, and others such as the production unit and Junior Red Cross. Contribution above the quota will be sent to the national fund.

Due to the shortage of metal, Red Cross tags will be given this year to those who have contributed to the fund. Contributions of \$1.00 and over will automatically entitle the donor to a year's membership to the Tule Lake Project Unit.

During the Red Cross Drive Week, proceeds from a movie and a dance will be turned over to the emergency fund, it was also disclosed.

The jobs open are 7 vegetable packers, 1 carloader, 1 liddor, 3 warehousemen and 15 harvesting crew men.

Colonist Teachers Conduct Occupational Survey

An occupational survey of the different jobs in the Project is being made by the colonist high school teachers and assistants.

The purpose of this survey is to make analysis of the types of work and develop a work experience and vocational guidance program for the high school students. While A.G. Ramey, supervisor of student teachers, and May Sato, educational research worker, are supervising the project.

It is estimated that there are approximately 25 different types of job titles in the Project. Each is outlined in a pamphlet. The nature of work, educational and personal requirements, employment opportunities both here and outside and promotion possibilities are analysed.

The pamphlet will be filed in the city and high school libraries. A. Glenwood Walker, assistant principal, prepared the survey.

Headed by Major Rinaudo, 12 members of the Oregon Women's Ambulance Corps toured the Project Thursday.

Six are members of the Klamath Falls OWAC, while four were from Portland. The Portland members visited the colony on their way to Klamath Falls, where they were to be presented with a new ambulance by the B.P.O.E. order 1247.
