EVACUEES ON LEAVE MAY OBTAIN FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION LEAFLET TO BE ISSUED THOSE DEPARTING

Evacuees on leave from relocation centers who get into emergency financial difficulties may receive assistance under an agreement worked out between the WRA and the Social Security Board and announced in Washington today.

"The new plan", Project Director Harvey M. Coverley pointed out, "does not in any sense imply that center residents who go out on leave are likely to be unable to make ends meet. It simply means that when they run into a problem too heavy for them to solve alone, the facilities of relief and welfare agencies are open to them, as well as to established residents of the communities."

Most local relief programs provide emergency medical care and living expenses to persons in need. Federal funds from the Social Security Board will be allocated to local agencies for aid to evacuees.

At the time of leaving Tule Lake every evacuee will be provided by the Project Leave Officer with a pamphlet "When you Leave The Relocation Center", which is being re-

vised to include suggestions as to what evacuees should do if they find themselves in need of public financial assistance.

"The local Red Cross Unit has used every opportunity to serve the people here in the project, and the work can be furthered by the generous contribu-

tions by the colonists during our recent drive," Sakahara stated.

Contributions totaled \$1743.04, and the sum over the project quota of \$1250 will be sent to the National Red Cross Headquarters.

SEN. CHANDLER PROPOSES EVACUEE FARM LABOR

Drastic proposals not only to slash the cost of WRA, whereby \$50,000,000 may be saved in annual operation, but to increase the nation's farm workers by use of 50,000 evacuees will be brought before the Senate committee by Senator Albert B. Chandler, Kentucky, Democrat, according to a story in the Chicago Herald-American Washington Bureau.

Senator Chandler, chairman of the military affair committee recently toured the projects to investigate conditions within the centers.

The senator favors placing between 30,000 and 40,000 Japanese-Americans of military age within the control of selective service.

In the story Chandler was quoted as saying that the ar-

BUS TO RENO SETS BAGGAGE LIMIT AT SIXTY POUNDS

Evacuees departing by the Reno bus cannot take more than sixty pounds of baggage on the bus it was revealed by the Leaves Office. But the difference between this amount and the 150 pounds allowed by their train ticket may be expressed to the Reno S.P. depot. To do this, the extra baggage must be brought to the project express office at least three days in advance of departure.

For those who are leaving on a Tuesday, extra pieces of baggage should be expressed on the preceding Friday. Each piece of baggage must clearly bear the evacuees' name and destination.

Evacuees may send their additional baggage by freight, if they do not wish to bear the additional expense by express; however, it would not cost more than \$3.00 for the additional ninety pounds.

my's recent effort to recruit military age Japanese into special combat units had proved a failure because of the Japanese to volunteer.

The farm workers, he said, would be distributed throughout the country with government assurance that they were not dangerous to security.

"If this plan goes through at all, it will go through rapidly, and the present farm shortage indicates there will be big demand for these experienced farmer."

Chandler pointed out that the War Relocation Authority is spending \$70,000,000 on the camps this year and wants more for next year.

"If we don't watch out we'll have another Indian Service on our hands and in our pocketbooks."

Their problems were just minor perplexities which any other ordinary family would encounter through daily living as working hard to make ends meet, the youngest girl being quarantined on account of measles, and other small irritations.

Mom starts to scold the children for their cattiness. The elder of the daughters would take it out on the younger for using too much shampoo because the canteens have run out of them. Pop gets irritated because mom talks too much and thus it seems as though there is a disintegration of the family. Out of this appearance of a family dissension, pop is suddenly taken seriously ill.

The whole family affection is united and is concentrated directly on the patient. Attraction for one another is found. The girls hold each other's hands and pray, and the laziest of the boys run energetically back and forth from the canteens asking Mom whether he can do anything more to help towards consolation of pop.

All in all isn't this a typical family?

...The once highlighted cases of juvenile delinquency have somewhat been reduced but still there seem to be group of misguided young boys pilfering articles off the counters of a certain canteen. Observing these boys, we find that their ages were only to be from 9 to 12 years of age.

Whether these actions are intentional or not it seems to us that there should be some way in which to teach them that this is altogether wrong and such actions are not a feat of courage within that group. It is some-

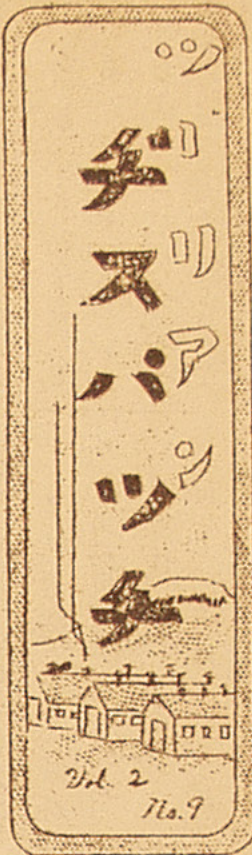
