### LEAVE ACTION SUSPENDED IN 'NO' OR 'QUALIFIED' CASES

Since procedures are being formulated in Washington for the handling of leave clearance applications on which the evacuees gave a negative or qualified answer to question 28, leave action in such cases is being suspended for the time being, it was announced by Lorne Huycke, Leave officer this week.

It will take as long as two or three months, before such applicants can receive advice as to the action being taken by Washington.

Until clarification can be made, applicants for leave clearance cannot leave the Project, it was emphasized.

Unnecessary confusion and disappointment will result if such persons apply for seasonal or indefinite leaves.

Highly pleased over the success of the initial group of language students from the relocation centers now studying at the U.S. Army Japanese Language school, Savage, Minnesota, the army is again planning to select for its school, an additional class of 250 men, it was announced by Paul F. Rusch, First Lieutenant, Infantry, assistant director of Personnel.

(Continued from Page 1) languages. He must have adequate command of the Japanese language, both oral and written. He should have facile use of "Hiragana," "Katakana," and a good number of "Kanji" normally used in written Japanese.

Men meeting the above qualifications will be given the opportunity of volunteering for enlistment in the United States Army, when the interviewing team visits the centers in the near future.

Men found linguistically qualified will be given a cursory physical examination by the Project doctor and if physically qualified he will be instructed to appear before a local board for voluntary induction into the military service.

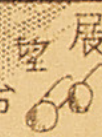
