

PROGRESS REVEALED

CROWD PACKS #2020 TO HEAR DILLON MYER

Speaking informally before an overcrowded group of issei and nisei at #2020 Dillon S. Myer, National Director of Relocation reviewed the progress made by the WRA since his visit here last October.

He reported that leave clearance program was progressing satisfactorily but that he hoped that it would be greatly accelerated in the near future.

"A few weeks ago," he said, "there were a little more than 1,000 relocated evacuees, now there are about 4,000."

Myer stressed the fact that the relocation centers were established as an emergency measure and it "was not intended to be a permanent thing."

Explaining the registration program which created confusion at many of the centers, the national director said; "One of the points of the recent registration was not only the formation of a combat unit by the War Department but it was also a means of determining whether

the evacuees wanted to stay in this country or some place else."

Another point he mentioned was by registration, experiences and abilities of the evacuees could be gathered and processed.

"The majority of the people on the outside," he said, "do not know that there are more col- (Cont. on page 2)

BLUE MT. AND WALLA WALLA CANNERIES SEEK WORKERS

Seventy-five workers to cut asparagus and vine harvest peas are wanted immediately by the Blue Mountain Canneries of Dayton, Washington. The Walla Walla Canning Company, also in Washington, wants thirty asparagus cutters as soon as possible. The work has already begun for both companies, according to Orville Butler and Thomas Nelson, company and F.S.A. representatives, respectively.

Both companies pay a minimum wage of 70¢ an hour, provide free transportation from Tule Lake and are within walking distances of the centers of their respective cities. Only the Walla Walla company has accommodations for families.

Adequate housing is provided. The Walla Walla company maintains an F.S.A. camp, while the Dayton cannery operates a Farm Labor Camp--consisting of ten modern buildings, each adequate to provide sleeping quarters for 48 men, and a main building with a dining room, kitchen, showers, laundry, recreation, and supply rooms.

Contracts may be examined and further information obtained at Warehouse 316, between 9 a.m.--12 noon, and 1:30 p.m.--4:30 p.m. On Saturday the company representatives will be available only in the morning.

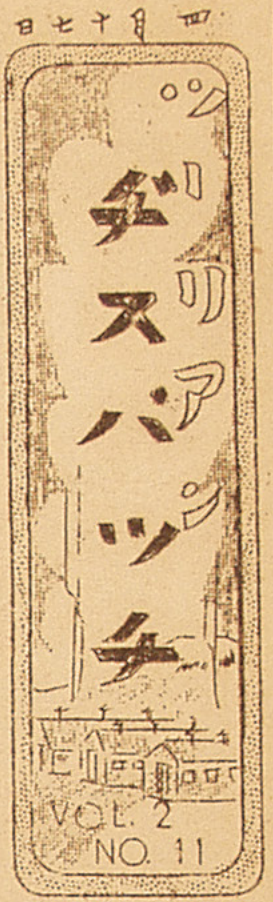
