

## SIX-POINT PROGRAM TO BACK MARCANTONIO BILL

### ASIATIC GROUPS CAMPAIGN

Representatives of various Asiatic groups hitherto ineligible to become naturalized citizens of the United States decided at their meeting last week upon a six-point program to publicize and campaign for the passage of

the Marcantonio Bill, according to a news release by the Japanese American Committee for Democracy.

This bill would amend the present Naturalization Law so that persons of Oriental nationality can become citizens of the United States.

## Sanitation Corps Is Efficient

Guided by Henry Omachi, chairman, the Tule Lake Sanitary Corps have done a remarkable job in maintaining health and sanitation in this Project. The Sanitary Corps was organized for the expressed purpose of:

1. Carrying out detailed, systematic inspections of mess halls, latrines, ironing rooms, laundry rooms, recreation halls and other facilities associated with public community health. (The latter include: quarantine and decontamination service, barber and beauty shops, canteens, tsukemono factory, hog and chicken farm, slaughter house, warehouses, butcher shops and public schools.)

2. Making tactful and opportune suggestions wherever necessary or requested to improve sanitary conditions.

3. By virtue of its organization, promoting and maintaining the highest standards of health possible in this community.

The present Sanitary Corps includes: inspectors--George Hayashida, Jack Hayashida, Tom Ishibashi, Satoshi Nakahira, George Omori, Yosh Yamamoto and Kiyoshi Yamamura; secretary--Florence Ishibashi; and laboratory technician--Mike Kashiwabara.

# TRAFFIC REGULATIONS SET TO INSURE SAFE DRIVING

Traffic regulations to insure maximum amount of safe driving was issued this week by Fenton R. Mahrt, Assistant Chief, Internal Security.

1. Speed Laws: 20 miles on paved street, 12 and 10 miles in school zone.
2. Not more than three can ride in the front seat of any vehicle.
3. All drivers must have a driver's license on person while driving.
4. No riders on tail gates, fenders, cab or top of canvas.
5. All drivers will be held responsible for any violation committed on vehicle checked out to them.
6. Crossing firebreaks is forbidden except in extreme emergency cases.
7. No one is allowed to drive down alley behind barracks except coal trucks, garbage, and emergency cars and then only when authorized to do so.
8. All drivers must be 16 years of age or over.
9. Two citations will be the cause for termination.
10. All special permits will be void until o.k'd by Internal Security.

(Continued from page 1) program to be initiated immediately is as follows:

1. A petition will be circulated to obtain at least one million signatures of people favoring the bill.
2. Endorsement of the bill will be obtained from prominent Americans.
3. A mass meeting in which all Asiatic groups in America will be represented will be called in New York followed by like meetings of other sections of the country to educate all Americans to the importance of this bill and to enlist their active participation in the campaign.
4. Pamphlets will be published to bring about a thorough understanding and to arouse interest in the problem of the whole relationship of the Asiatic people to the rest of the American people.
5. A national broadcast is planned with Congressman Marcantonio as speaker.
6. Advertisements publicizing the bill will appear nationally in newspapers.

## OPENERS IN CITY WARD CASABA TOURNAMENT SAT.

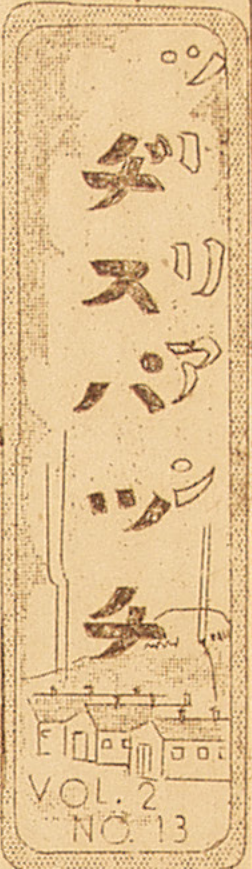
