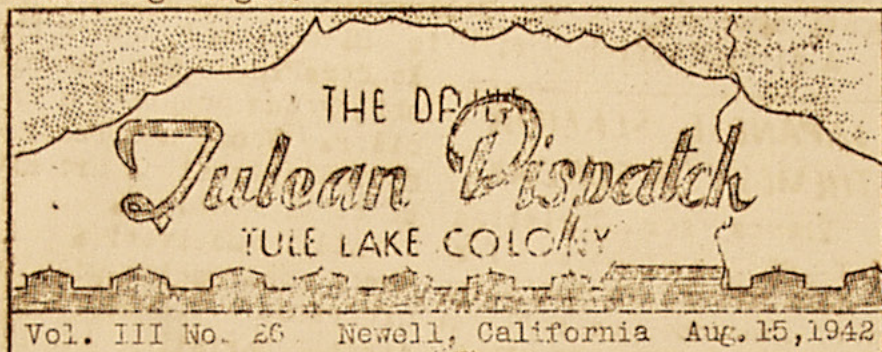


ORATORS WANTED
