Farm equipment machinery is urgently wanted by Mr. Jun Miyakawa, #2603-C, for Japanese-American farmers at Kingsburg, Colorado.

Mr. Miyakawa will pay cash for the following farm tractors: John Deere-General Purpose Model A tractor; Farmall Model H tractor; Caterpillar Model RD 2 tractor; International TD6 tractor; Allis Chalmers-Model WF.

Mr. Miyakawa is also interested in other farm machinery and will be pleased to discuss the matter with any interested parties.

1. Only those who do not have Federal Civil Service rating and are qualified for clearance should call at the Placement office for registration.
2. When you register, you will be given two (2) copies of Form 57 which is to be made out and returned to Mrs. Busselle, Personnel officer, in the Administration building. They need not be notarized.
3. Anyone having a State Civil Service rating is urged to register immediately since all civil service names are being forwarded to Washington.
4. Those who have registered and did not receive Form 57 should call at the Placement office for their copies.

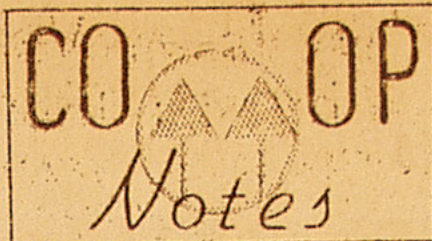
This is what was done at one center in honoring the volunteers who will soon be inducted.

Farmers owning such machinery will benefit more by selling their farm machinery now than they will if this machinery is requisitioned by the Government.

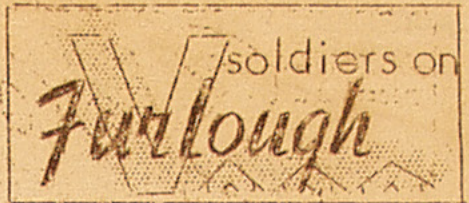
ART CLASS SIGN-UP
