

# 467 SCHOOLS CLEARED FOR EVACUEE STUDENTS

## PROCEDURE GIVEN FOR PROSPECTIVE PERSONS

About 467 schools have been cleared to accept evacuee students, according to Miss McKaye, Student Relocation chairman, who has been helping evacuees make arrangements to continue with their higher education.

"For the quickest results all students who are desirous of leaving the school should write to the National Student Relocation Council, explaining the kind of school they would like to attend," she said. "Some students have been contacting schools on their own with discouraging results."
