## Relocation Supervisor Tells Of Conditions In New York

New York, the nation's largest metropolis, is the one large city where there has not been an influx of war workers and, consequently, where there is no great shortage of housing facilities. New York is the nation's center of art, music, and theater, writes Robert M. Cullum, relocation supervisor, New York area.

Employment needs in New York City are lower than most other places. Building trade workers, teachers, or social workers should not go to New York because there is a surplus of these workers.

In comparison with the centers of war industry, New York wages are generally lower; although there are better opportunities to relocate permanently than probably in any other large city. This is particularly true for people who have had experience in the export and import trade and in the distribution of goods through domestic

markets. These occupations centered in New York in the pre-war period but at the present time there is a lull in these activities.

The cost of living is favorable in many respects, although it cannot be termed low. The general level of rents for both single persons and families is lower than most cities.

Clothing is also cheaper.

Stenographers and clerical workers who will command about \$25 a week in New York are advised to come in group of two or more so that they can live together and share expenses.

The city offers exceptional opportunities for people who want to get (cont. on page 2)

## RETURN OF EVACUEES DISCUSSED

Over the one-hour "Town Meeting of the Air" radio program last Thursday evening, the topic "Should All Japanese Be Excluded from the Pacific Coast for the Duration of the War" was discussed.

Congressman John M. Costello, California Democrat and

chairman of the house subcommittee on un-American activities, argued that the evacuees should not be released from the relocation centers to return to the west coast, or, for that matter, he was opposed to letting evacuees out of the centers to go anywhere for

the duration. He stated that evacuation was carried out because of "military necessity" and that returning of the persons of Japanese ancestry would endanger the country's internal security.

Taking the opposite point of view--that evacuees should be able to return to the west coast--was Carey McWilliams, author of many books on racial problems such as "Brothers Under the Skin," etc. He based his argument on the point that loyal Japanese-Americans should have the same privileges as all other American citizens and that to discriminate against a certain group of people just because of race was not his conception of the American democratic way of life.

Each speaker was questioned by an "attorney" as well as by the members of the audience.

No definite conclusion was made at the end of the program.

## Myer Tells Work Done By WRA

In a nation-wide radio broadcast, Dillon S. Myer clarified the work of the WRA. He emphasized that the WRA is operating on a minimum of staff and is doing a maximum of constructive work in restoring the constitutional rights of the Japanese-Americans who are proved loyal

and deserving.

He cautioned the people that we are being watched by many allied nations as to whether we actually uphold the principles we are fighting for. He added that Japan is closely observing our treatment of the Japanese evacuees and that any maltreatment of the

Japanese in this country would call for a retaliatory measure by Japan of Americans interned by them.

Within a few weeks, after a close investigation of past records, there will take place a segregation of the loyal and disloyal evacuees, said Myer.

specialized training in such lines as interior decoration, clothing design, home economics, business administration, accounting, etc., because of the many specialized schools for day and night pupils.

Similar conditions prevail in Philadelphia, with housing reasonably easy to obtain.

Mr. Cullum states that his office is developing jobs for individuals who are approved and want to relocate in that section. He informs the Dispatch that there is a demand for accountants and people with experience in income tax work. There are excellent opportunities for couples in domestic work and gardening, where very satisfactory housing is provided and good wages are paid. There are a few offers with separate housing to accommodate families with children.

In some of the other large cities in this area served by the New York office, industrial employment opportunities are available at higher wages; but the higher the wage the more difficult the housing problem.

Rural sections provide year-around employment opportunities, particularly in the dairy sections. In the truck growing sections of Long Island and New Jersey, there is a shortage of labor and it is thought the New York office can place as many experienced truck farmers as want to go there. The wages are low compared to the wages paid for the same kind of work on the West Coast.
