QUESTIONS ON SEGREGATION DISCUSSED

At a regular bi-weekly meeting of the issei block representatives and Project Director Harvey Coverley held last Thursday an interesting period of questions and answers pertaining to segregation was had. Coverley emphasized that the colonists should not jump to any final conclusions until the conferees return from Denver with clear-cut decisions.

Following is a brief outline of the questions and answers discussed at the meeting:

Q. Can the decision be reversed with respect to the segregation policy? (Disloyal going out and loyal remaining)

A. The people's wish will be presented to Dillon S. Myer at the Denver conference. However, it must be borne in mind that, unless a eleventh camp is built, the same problem will be faced in whichever project is chosen.

Q. What will be the status of returned internees?

A. There is no definite decision on this question. There are three classes of people who are to be segregated: (1) Those who applied for repatriation and have not withdrawn the request prior to July 1, 1943; (2) those denied leave clearances; and (3) those who answered the loyalty question in the negative or so qualified their answer that it practically was the same as being answered

in the negative, those who didn't register, and those declared disloyal after a hearing. It can be said that internees coming under this classification will be considered disloyal.

Q. Are foodstuffs to be confiscated that has been purchased by the evacuees?

A. Food rightfully belonging to an evacuee may be removed upon relocation. Government issued food remains the property of the government until it is expended. It is expended only by consumption.

Q. If a nisei answers "no" and parents answer "yes" can arrangements be made to keep the family together?

A. No policy will be adopted which will separate immediate members of a family. More definite answer will be given after the Denver meeting.

Q. Can one have a choice of project to go to?

A. Both questions are being considered and probably will be answered in the affirmative.

Q. If the head of a family were to leave for relocation, what will happen to the dependants?

A. With-hold any decision until after the Denver conference. There is a great deal of time for discussions and answering questions to problems that may arise.

Q. Are those persons who reverse their answers entitled to a hearing?

A. Probably yes, but wait until the conference for fuller details.

Q. Are those who didn't register entitled to a hearing?

A. Yes.

Q. If a person chooses to remain here, can he stay?

A. Unanswerable.

Q. Are those nisei who were sent to the CCC camp because of registration entitled to a hearing?

A. Yes.

Q. Would those on seasonal leave be entitled to join their family wherever they may be sent?

A. Yes.

Q. Will the present mode of living be continued wherever one is sent?

A. Common sense would indicate that it should be the same or better.

Q. How long will applications for seasonal and indefinite leave be accepted in view of the circumstance?

A. Will be issued up to the date of departure for those qualified. Those planning to leave are encouraged to leave.

Q. If a man is out on a contract, can he come back to settle business matters?

A. An individual matter. But it must be remembered that breach of contract is a serious offense.

After the question period, two recommendations were presented to Coverley to be presented at the Denver conference:

1. Send people to centers of their own choice.

2. Please see to it that necessary supply of lumber of crating material be furnished evacuees when they move.

Upon conclusion of the meeting, Coverley announced his induction into the army and expressed his regrets in having to leave.

After thanking the people of Tule Lake, he announced his successor to be Ray Best, director of the isolation camp at Laupp, Arizona.
