NO ARMY CONTROL IN CAMP

Q. When the Tule Lake Center becomes a segregation center, will the Army take over inside as well as outside the camp?
A. The WRA will continue to be the agency responsible for the internal administration of the segregation center and present plans do not contemplate that the Army will have anything to do with WRA policies in administering the Center. We do not now know the extent to which the Army will alter its policies with respect to external guarding.

ABOUT FORM 130

Q. Will the Application for Indefinite Leave, Form 130, be used to apply for a segregation hearing? If so, does this mean that those who leave this Center will have pledged themselves to relocate from the new center to which they are going?

A. No. In the first place, Form 130, Application for Indefinite Leave will not be used for segregation hearings. The notice which appeared a week ago in the Tulean Dispatch concerning the use of Form 130 was in error. Segregation is not for the purpose of forcing anyone to relocate, and there will be no forced relocation of anyone from the new relocation centers to which people choose to go. CO-OP SQUELCHES RUMOR ON JAPANESE MERCHANDISE

There have been rumors circulating among the colonists that the Co-op received a tremendous amount of Japanese merchandise from a former importer and exporter of Sacramento, California. In order to clarify matters and to present the actual facts, the management wishes to inform the colonists as follows:

1. 100 cases of merchandise were delivered to the evacuee at this Project.
2. Of the 100 cases, 30 were taken by the evacuee himself, 50 were de-

basis in the future as in the past. The only difference will be that persons remaining in the Tule Lake Center will not be allowed to go out from that center for the duration except under unusual circumstances.

NO CLOSING OF CENTERS

Q. Is it true that the other nine centers will be closed down immediately following segregation, thus forcing those leaving the Tule Lake Center to relocate?

A. The WRA has no present intention of closing down the other nine centers, and there will be no forced relocation of their inhabitants. The Congress of the United States has appropriated all the money WRA asked for to operate the centers for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1944, and there is no reason to believe that the Congress will not continue to appropriate money for the operation of the relocation centers so long as the centers are necessary.

3. Out of the 50 cases delivered, only the items listed below were found to be in good condition and the remainder, which was unsalable, to be returned to the evacuee. Goods accepted by Co-op for sale were:

- 23 cans shirataki, 8 cans takenoko, 29 cans awabi, 28 cans temoura, 6 cans aburage, 16 cans (lg.) aburage, 19 cans (lg.) mushrooms, 39 cans water chestnuts, 15 doz. btls. vinegar.
4. The merchandise actually purchased by the Co-op was insufficient to distribute to all the canteens; therefore, it was sold at Center No. 1, with the exception of vinegar, which was distributed to all the canteens equally. No other merchandise was received.


