## 3 Graduates Receive Scholarship Grants

Three Tri-State High School graduates, Shigeo Nakanishi, Ellen Hasegawa, and Miyoko Inouye have been named as recipients of a scholarship grant of approximately \$250 per person by the Scholarship Award Committee.

"All three are in need of financial assistance to go on to higher education and are head and

shoulders above the rest of the applicants scholastically and in other respects also," states the report made by the Scholarship Award Committee.

## Vegetables Shipped Out

The first carload of vegetables from the Tule Lake farm was shipped to the Gila River Project on July 29, it was disclosed.

Since then vegetables have also been shipped to Colorado River project and Manzanar.

The schedule since July 29 has been as follows: Gila--229 crates of spinach, 805 crates of peas and 320 crates of lettuce; Colorado River Project--563 crates of lettuce, 378 crates of spinach, 347 crates of turnips, 178 crates of peas, and 72 crates green onions; Manzanar--144 crates of spinach, 152 crates of turnips and 150 crates of peas.

Already 7 carloads of vegetables have been shipped to these centers where fresh vegetables are scarce.

The two Californians, Shigeo Nakanishi and Miyoko Inouye, are formerly of Rio Vista and Sacramento, respectively. Ellen Hasegawa hails from Kelso, Washington.

With nearly \$650 realized for the Scholarship Fund, the P.T.A. results have yet to be acknowledged. Leading contributors to the drive are the C.Y.F. with \$50; Dr. and Mrs. Hannaford, \$50; S.C.A. \$27; Miss Warren, \$25. The total amount made available by the teachers, home rooms and clubs is \$156.57.

Contributions may yet be turned in to the high school administration building. As more money is turned in, additional scholarship grants may be awarded.

The original goal for the drive was set at \$2500 dollars.

A. The movement of all members of the Health Section is directly controlled by Dr. Thompson, the national head of the Health Service of the War Relocation Authority.

Q. In what group will an individual be who registered late and answered Question 28 "No"?  
A. He will be in Group II and will come before the Interview Board the same as others of that group.
