TULEANS REPORT WHY THEY ARE RELOCATING

With more and more Tuleans relocating every day, the DISPATCH's roving reporter inquired few of them the questions: "Why are you relocating?" and "Do you advise others to relocate?" Here are some of the answers:

GLORIA TAMURA--"I am relocating with intentions of furthering my education and for the general betterment of myself."

LILLIAN IGARASHI--"After staying in camp for more than a year, I decided to relocate in order to have the freedom and privileges which other evacuees and Americans are enjoying today."

KIMIKO KATO--"I think relocation is an important factor for the readjustment of students, individuals and families who wish to resume their normal living."

WILBUR TAKEGUCHI--"During my stay in camp I have been at a complete standstill both mentally and economically. I am relocating at this time to start from the bottom and to match wits with fellow Americans outside. I say definitely that relocation is a challenge to every nisei who desires a future in this country."

PAUL TAKAHASHI--"Like many evacuees I am relocating because conditions have been reported favorable and opportunities plentiful. If I establish myself now, I know my future will be that much better."

JAMES EGUSA--"I have decided to relocate before the segregation takes place, thus avoiding a double move. I personally think, now is a good a time as any to relocate. I hope that my going out will set a favorable example for others to follow."

WRA Centers Not To Be Closed In Near Future

MYER SENDS TELEGRAM

The following telegram regarding the rumor that relocation centers would be closed in the near future was received from Director Dillon S. Myer:

"I am anxious to correct an impression which has been created in some places that some or all the relocation centers are to be closed in the near future. While it is true that the long range goal of the War Relocation Authority is to enable as many as possible of the eligible evacuees to relocate, we realize that it will be a slow process. We have no plans for closing any relocation center in the immediate future. As relocation takes place and more people move outside, we expect to close some centers but this will not take place in the near future. There will be no compulsion to relocate outside of centers although we hope that an increasing number of people now living in relocation centers will find it to their advantage to relocate and become self supporting."

EDITORIAL

RELOCATE NOW

Many colonists, both nisei and issei, have been debating for sometime whether or not to find work on the outside. They have, apparently, been weighing the advantages with the disadvantages of getting work on the outside.

There are no disadvantages in relocating now. Everything is in the colonists' favor. You have your future to think of. The sooner you begin shaping this future, the better off you will be.

The myth that people are hostile to Japanese-Americans has now been fairly well exploded by the colonists themselves who have gone to all parts of the Middle West and East and parts of the South. Japanese-Americans everywhere are received well, wherever they have gone, with few exceptions; and some of these "exceptions" were induced by the behavior of colonists themselves.

Nothing will be gained by crying over spilt milk. What is past is past. Because of evacuation, many colonists are inclined to be bitter and to be uncooperative now that the WRA is greatly facilitating colonists to relocate, and the Government is asking for man-power. To allow bitterness to cloud your decisions will hurt no one but you. The WRA is doing its utmost to get you to relocate now to almost any part of the country you may choose, and paying your way. Floods of job offers are received daily from all relocation officers throughout the country. Opportunities unlike any offered heretofore are now available to you and only your willingness to accept them stands in the way of rehabilitation and assimilation into American life.

Whatever deters you from making a wise choice now is a form of slavery—slavery to your own fear, resentment, indecision. Throw off the shackles and accept the full freedom now offered you.

It takes a stout heart to live in any country these days.

It takes a stout heart even to live. But the dividends are manifold for those who have courage.

MORE ABOUT GRANADA WRA CENTER

(Continued from yesterday)

EDUCATION

The education department, comprising elementary, junior and senior high schools, occupies the whole of one particular block. Pre-school classes and kindergarten are conducted in the various recreation halls scattered throughout the project. The educational program is conducted in cooperation with the Colorado State Department of Education and offers curriculums not unlike those of any comparable institution outside the center. A new high school building is now in use. On the regular staff are 47 Caucasians and 182 evacuee teachers.

Special adult classes are held nightly to teach typing, shorthand, English, dressmaking, drafting, handicraft, and fine arts.

CHURCH GROUPS

The religion of Amache is predominantly Protestant with representatives from the following denominational groups; Methodist, Baptist, Presbyterian, Holiness and Seventh Day Adventist. Their total membership approximate 2,000 with 15 ordained ministers who take turn in conducting services every Sunday.

The next largest group are those of the Buddhist faith. They number about 600 and conduct their services in both languages. The Catholics hold their mass on Saturday mornings, officiated by

a Father who resides in the neighboring town of Holly.

AGRICULTURE

The actual land under the farm section embraces 4,095 acres known as the XY and 5,688 acres known as the Koën ranches.

A significant feature of the center's agricultural project is the growing of a large variety of vegetables, that never before were tried in this region. Every indication is that most of them will be successfully grown and should they be so, it will be an event of great importance to the agricultural welfare of this part of the state.

Poultry, hog, and cattle raisings are also included in the general farm program.

RELOCATION

Up to the early spring of this year Granada Relocation Center has been a convenient point of embarkation to the various employment fields in the states surrounding Colorado. A list of job opportunities is posted daily in conspicuous places and in the center newspaper PIONEER so the evacuees will be able to form their opinion as to the most satisfactory place of resettlement.

Amache, as a whole, has enjoyed the reputation of being one of the most peaceful of the ten centers. So far there has been no disturbance of any sort by the residents in opposition to the policies laid down by the government.

アンダーソン氏は過去八年土地保護法に従事しておられたから、此の方面の農業状態に就いては精通されてゐると共に、農業上の機会に關した首疑に對し、明確な返答を與へる上に於て、最適任者である。人口は曲豆鏡な川の流域に沿つて集中し、多くの農経営の機会が存在してゐる。之等の盆地では砂糖大根、アルナル、小麦及び種々の野菜が集約的に栽培される。此の外に牛羊の牧畜が盛んである。數千を數へる羊牛に砂糖大根のバルブ糖蜜、或はアルナルを喰べさせて太りされてゐる。その結果最上のプライムビーフ、或はラムが此の方面から供給されると。

なほ同氏は續つて多くの人はモンタナ、ワイオミング、ダコタと云へば嚴しい風土を持つてゐる。極端に考慮してゐるが、農耕期は實際に於ては、湖より永く大抵の所ではさう極端に嚴しくはない。

當居住民は屢々「テイラー」の住子口を欲望しておられる予を觀察したと、或る場合はこうした欲求も満たされ得る予もあるが、大体から云へば失望されて来た場合の方が多し、それは或る條件が彼等の認可と一致しなかつたからだ。これを前提として同氏は外部移住の意向ある個人及び家族に對して先づ最初住子口を得て其の後世評や信用を確立してから各自の職務に成功しやうと努力すべきであらうと語つた。アンダーソン氏は元來各個人並に家族を農園に移住さす可く當所に出張されたのでなく、居住民をバンデ場の諸首府に關心する多くの家族に對して、
