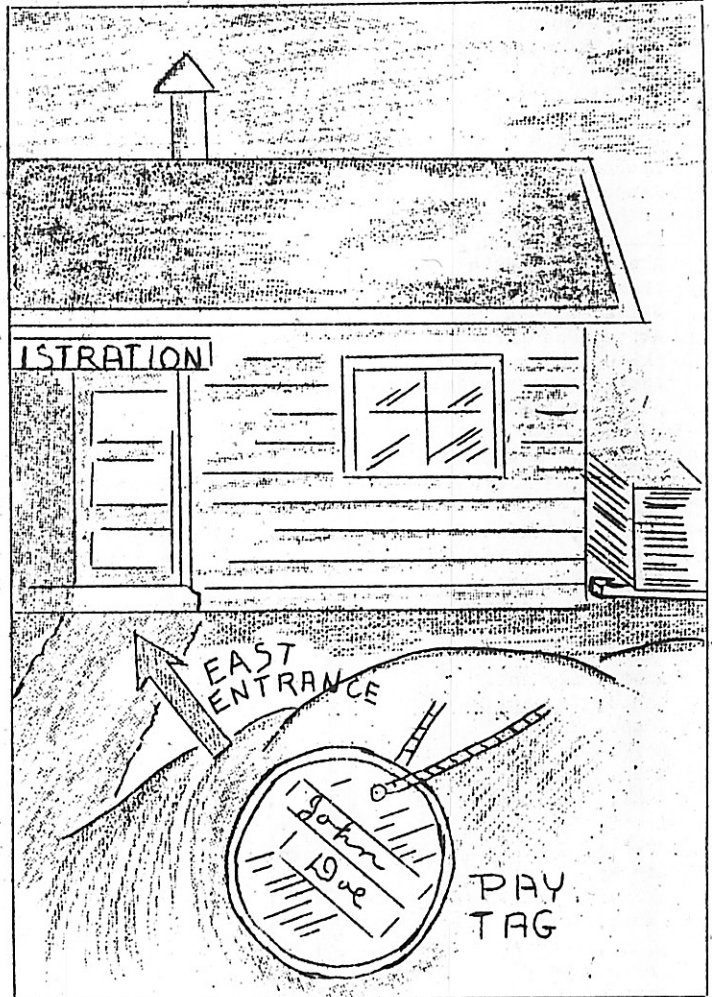

Inasmuch as government regulations require positive identification before checks are delivered, payees are requested to bring some means of identifying themselves, preferably Form 402 which they received upon reporting to work at Marysville, Alien Registration card, driver's license, Selective Service Certificate or some other evidence against which their signatures may be verified.
