

STORE PROFIT \$5,313 IN JUNE

ALMOST 30% OF NET SALES

Community stores of the Tule Lake Project made a profit of \$5,313.89 or 22.95 percent of the net sales during the period between May 28 and June 30, according to a Profit and Loss Statement released today.

Those proceeds are being held in trust for the community and will not be offset by any possible losses incurred by the Project as a whole, through operation of any other enterprise.

No supervisory salaries have been or will be charged to the operating expenses of Community Enterprises. Such salaries including those of Kendall Smith, acting superintendent of community enterprises; Frank Blodgett, associate superintendent of community enterprises, and Mortimer C. Cooke, former super-

intendent and now acting chief of the transportation and supply division are paid directly from the War Relocation Authority in San Francisco.

A complete audit of the Community Store's book and the Profit and Loss Statement was made by Sumio Miyamoto, senior on the audit; and Harry Fujii, junior. The audit was prepared on instructions from Gilbert L. Niesse, Chief of the Administrative Division.

Miyamoto, 3213-B, formerly was income tax examiner with the California

State Franchise Tax Division at Sacramento. He holds a Master of Science Degree in Business Administration from the University of California. Fujii, 3106-A, formerly was intermediate accountant-clerk for three years with the California State Department of Employment of Sacramento.

Immediately on completion of the audit, all mark-ups in the stores were reduced to 10% of the cost with the exception of soft drinks and candies. Tobaccos and cigarettes were reduced to cost.
