4 DOCTORS TO LEAVE

TOGASAKI WOMEN MEDICS ARE HERE

Because of the necessity of balancing the medical skill for all WRA projects, rather than the need of a single project, a decision relative to changes in the Tule Lake Base Hospital personnel was reached by Regional WRA Medical Officer, Dr. G. D. Thompson, the announcement of which was made public this weekend.

The hospital personnel who are to be transferred and their respective destinations are:

Dr. M. A. Harada, Central Utah Project at Topaz; Dr. George S. Iki, Gila River Project, Rivers, Arizona; Dr. Jiro Muiamoto, Manzanar Project; Dr. Hajime Uyeyama, Granada, Colorado; Lillian Akiya, student nurse, Rohwer, Arkansas.

To replace those who are leaving, two doctors and one registered nurse—the Togasaki family of women doctors—have already arrived here.

They are Dr. Kazue Togasaki, obstetrics and gynecology; Dr. Yoshiye Togasaki, pediatrician; and Mrs. Chiye Yamanaka (nee Togasaki), Registered and Public Health nurse.

Dr. Teru Togasaki accompanied her sister, Dr. Yoshiye, from Manzanar because of her illness. Dr. Teru is expected to return to the Poston center as soon as Dr. Yoshiye gets well.

A tentative arrangement has been made to secure three more doctors; Dr. Hashiba, surgeon from Fresno; Dr. Baba, general practitioner and surgery from Gila; and Dr. Hara, general practitioner from Topaz.

ADDITIONS MADE TO 8-MAN FOOTBALL RULES

1. Score

a. When a team is 45 points ahead at the end of the first half or if they secure such a lead during the second half, the game is ended immediately.

2. Offensive team

a. Only one pass (forward) allowed in one play.

b. Any number of laterals may be used behind or across the scrimmage line.

c. Forward reverse allowed-(may pass forward after such a reverse.)

d. Must pause 1 second after a shift before the snap.

3. Defensive team

a. Any formation permissible.

b. May use hands to ward off.

4. Passing

a. The ball shall not be passed forward: (1) by a passer who is beyond his scrimmage line or (2) During any play not from scrimmage.

b. The ball will be declared dead if two consecutive incomplete forward passes cross the opponent's goal line and the opponent will put the ball in play on their own 20 yard line.

5. Kicking

a. The kickers may recover and advance a kick which has not crossed the scrimmage line.

recover: (1) a kick which has crossed the line and which has been first touched beyond the line by a receiver--ball is dead where recovered and shall be put in play by the kickers.

6. Time outs

a. Time will not be called for substitutions but substitutes must go in when the ball is dead.

7. Penalties

a. Loss of 5 yards on a flying block.

b. Loss of down when (1) legal forward pass is incomplete, and (2) ball is carried across the scrimmage line before clear pass is made.
