With transfers and departures of professional personnel imminent, the Base Hospital has adopted the clinic schedule, which is given below, to be effective immediately, Dr. Pedicord, disclosed today. Outstanding changes are as follows:

No medical clinic in the mornings.

Sick baby clinic every week morning in the old outpatient wing.

Immunization clinic for children on Thursday mornings in the new Outpatient wing.

No more house calls by physicians.

All patients will be brought to the hospital in either a car or a stretcher in an ambulance depending upon the type of illness.

No children will be seen in the afternoons.

For the equitable distribution of medical attention to everyone in the colony, it was requested that all persons cooperate as fully as possible with the staff of the hospital by observing the set clinic schedule.
