CONTROL ON CARS EXPECTED

That ceiling prices set by the Office of Price Administration must be observed in the sale of farm machinery and trucks was stated in a telegram received yesterday by J. S. Lowery

of the Evacuee Property office from the War Relocation Authority in San Francisco,

The contents of the telegram is as follows:

BEET WORKERS RECRUITED

To recruit 35 to 40 farm laborers and sugar beet workers, Leonard G. Ball of the Utah-Idaho Sugar Co. and Ray Yasui, formerly of Tule Lake, arrived on the Project Thursday, May 13, it was revealed by Frank D. Fagan, Placement officer.

Wages run from \$100 to \$125 per month, and homes are supplied for families with electricity, running water, and other modern conveniences. It may be the last chance for evacuees to go out to the Utah-Idaho Sugar Co. Interested persons apply at Placement office.

NURSE'S AIDS BADLY NEEDED

Since the hospital is still in a critical situation due to the shortage of nurse's aides, the recently organized aid-the-hospital committee has been very busy devising ways to recruit the needed people, it was reported.

There is an urgent need of 51 males or females immediately to take over these jobs. The hospital at present is not able to nurse and care for as many patients as they would like.

Anyone over 16 years is eligible to apply for either

part time or full time work. Interested persons are asked to call at the Placement office for an assignment sheet or they may report

to the information desk at the Base Hospital and ask for an interview with the Head Nurse, Miss Dunley. The most favorable hours for such an interview would be from 10 a.m.-11:30 a.m. and from 2-3:30 in the afternoon. If these hours are not convenient, applicants may leave their names with

Miss Imiel at the information desk.

Even though this is not an accredited training hospital for nurses, employees may ask for references when they relocate, and in many instances girls have been able to obtain work in hospitals outside.

MAY HARVEST POTATO CROP

Potato growers in the Tule Lake area were advised by Senator Sheridan Downey (D-Calif.) that evacuee labor from the Newell Center may be used in harvesting of potatoes next fall, according to the recent issue of the Pacific Citizen.

Cost Of Building Our Center

In the recent issue of the Pacific Citizen it was disclosed that the cost of the Tule Lake Relocation Project was \$6,975,419 as revealed to the Klamath Herald and News by Congressman Lowell Stockman.

At the newspaper's request, Stockman obtained the first figures published in this area on cost and operation of the center. Construction cost figure was obtained from Sec. of War Stimson. According to E.M. Rowalt, acting di-

rector of the War Relocation Authority, the cost of operation from July 1, 1942 through March 31, 1943 totaled \$4,947,398.76. He added that the current cost of operation is \$457.33 per man year, based on 10,818 man years.
