NEW HOSTEL PROJECT AGRICULTURAL To Eliminate IN CHICAGO PROGRAM MUST SUCCEED Gambling

A new hostel, to be known as the Mutual Service Center, has been opened in Chicago, the Placement office revealed yesterday.

Applicants for this center, which has been organized and financed by a group of Chicago residents of Japanese ancestry, are now being accepted at the Placement office. The building will house about 50 people.

Asked by the TULEAN DISPATCH to comment on a statement at the project directors' meeting in Washington last week that WRA probably would be unable to maintain present dietary standards for relocation center residents unless the agricultural program is pushed through, Mr. C. E. Zimmer agreed in substance.

Mr. Zimmer declared, "I do not think there is any question but that evacuees will really have to get out in the fields and work if mess hall meals are to be kept up to their present levels. Pitched to meet year-round food needs, the 1943 agricultural program should provide most of the vegetables, and a large share of the meat and eggs needed on the mess hall tables. We have the land,

Vents Cut In Mess Ceilings Dangerous

Cutting ventilation holes in the ceilings of mess halls invites fire hazards of a grave nature, according to Fire Chief Ernest Rhodes.

"All such practices must be discontinued at once. This is necessary for the protection of life and property in the event of a fire," Mr. Rhodes explained.

Should a fire break out in a mess hall with ventilation in the ceiling, the fire would spread rapidly because the ventilation holes act as drafts. This would spread the fire quickly and

seed, stock, and equipment to produce as much of these foods as the ordinary civilian expects to get this year. The only unknown factor is labor."

 centers will produce two-thirds or more of the meat and eggs needed, while others which get started late will not produce so much. Since some centers are in a better position to produce certain types of food than others, not all this produce will be raised at Tule Lake but will be shipped in from other projects.
