SEASONAL WORKERS MAY GET AID IN GOING TO PERMANENT JOBS

Evacuees on seasonal leave who wish to go to some other locality on indefinite leave and who need financial assistance to get to the new place of employment should apply to the nearest relocation officer instead of returning to the center, WRA ruled this week.

The ruling is based on a supplement to the administrative instruction which covers the payment of transportation and initial living expense grants.

Ordinarily, evacuees on seasonal leave earn enough to enable them to get started in a permanent job with-

out financial assistance from the government. For that reason, the instruction states, a grant will be issued to an applicant on seasonal leave only after a careful check of his cash resources.

Specifically prohibited by the instruction are grants "where an evacuee (on seasonal leave) has returned to a relocation center merely to secure such assistance and to leave for other employment on indefinite leave and the travel back to the project and to the place of indefinite leave is substantially in excess of the travel distance from the place of seasonal leave to the initial destination on indefinite leave."

RELOCATION INFORMATION

A library, with a shelf containing material on relocation, complete with a large reading table has been installed in the Placement office for the benefit of the residents, according to Frank D. Fagan, Placement officer.

All information available about different sections of the country such as location and description of cities and states, also population, cost of living, etc., may be found.

No papers or periodicals are to be taken from the office, it was emphasized.

SEATTLE ORGANIZATION TO FIGHT FOR EVACUEES

The evacuees, and nisei in general, were recently jolted by the Supreme Court's decision upholding the evacuation policy of the War Department in the Yasui-Hirabayashi test cases. However, the decision did not affect the friendship of those sincerely interested in the Japanese-American problems.

A telegram was received by the DAILY TULEAN DISPATCH and it reads as follows:

WE DEEPLY REGRET SUPREME COURT DECISION UPHOLDING CONSTITUTIONALITY OF EVACUATION POLICY. WE WANT YOU TO KNOW OF OUR CONTINUING FRIENDSHIP AND OF OUR RESOLVE TO KEEP ON WORKING IN EVERY WAY POSSIBLE FOR A RESTORATION OF THAT HISTORIC AMERICANISM WHICH HOLDS ALL CITIZENS EQUAL UNDER LAW.
