Ex-Tuleans Get Photos In St. Louis Newspaper

Under the banner headline, "Americans of Japanese Descent Find Jobs in St. Louis" a recent issue of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch of St. Louis, Missouri, devotes one entire page of their pictorial section in showing photographs and in telling the story of evacuees who have relocated to that city. Included in the photos are three former Tule Lake residents, Dr. Masauki Hara, Mrs. Mary Hara and Florence Abe.

Dr. Hara is a resident physician at the Alexian Brothers Hospital and Mrs. Hara is a bacteriologist at the City Hospital. Florence Abe is office secretary of the Y.W.C.A.

Other photos show evacuees working on a farm, in a library, in advertising work, in domestic work, and in other professional employment.

NISEI WOMEN IN CENTERS CAN'T VOLUNTEER FOR WACS

The WRA office in Washington stated that at the present time nisei women residing in the relocation centers cannot volunteer and be inducted into the WACS, according to the Gila News-Courier.

However, nisei residing outside the centers are accepted as evidenced by the recent in-

隔離問題に關する

マイヤー局長の声明文

戰時責任局長セントラーは居住する日系市民の福祉の爲にその責任を背負つてゐる。此の責任の實施方針として總体多數はアメリカ市民となる事を欲する強き意志を示す。若し合衆國に忠誠を誓ふべきならばアメリカの戰爭参加の標的に對しては否同情的意志を表明せられた事に依つてその履行上事實的總體に於ては並行形式である。WRAは此ニシテこの責任を國家の利益を保護する上は於て總體の責任を感ずる。WRAの責任はアメリカ人の生活様式に順應するを欲する者としてアメリカ民衆との調和保持を欲せざる兩シテプロパガンダを遂行する事。WRAの全の策は是に到達した。以来隔離政策の手續は進行した。故である。全一箇所の收容所に於ける忠誠或は忠誠的である。居住民はウィー湖に移動し居る。他のセントラーに移動されるが寧ろ当局

は積極的の外部兩責任者である。隔離政策遂行後の人口はその居住民の利害が合衆國の安寧と結合するが故に責任所より外部諸團體に移動する事を許される。隔離政策遂行した環境ウィー湖は移動し居る。居住民は何等刑罰を加へる懲罰は免れぬのである。WRAは未だ此の自業の微塵も無き事實を宣明した。此の人の誠意を充分に認識してゐる。ウィー湖に對しては勿論外部責任の特典は消滅し、且つ現在彼等の居住するセントラーに於て隔離實施は停止せらる。隔離問題はアメリカ人としての風習に於て生活し且つ戰時産業に妨害するべき主義を標榜する立派な人の特典を失ふべき約束を提議する。それは收容所に於て規律の保証を要する。外部移動を承認され人々の公衆の承諾を要するが故に斯うする事に依つて外部兩責任を支持し得る。如何なる人々が隔離せざるやとの決定的問題は一つに公平なる精神と正義に於て解決を見る。

隔離遂行過程に於て移動せざるを得ない人々には幾多の面倒は直面する。様と思はれるが國家の利害關係と並進して幾千を救ふ忠誠日系市民及公衆に從ふ散居外人の福祉と意思の問題とするに足らぬ。

自令は各收容所の居住者かどうか將に未らんとする隔離政策の円滑に滞在する眞の目的とそれを遂行する手續は環境を人々を切望して居るものである。
