## THREE CO-OP DELEGATES LEAVE FOR CONFERENCE

To set up a permanent buying office in New York, consisting of three buyers, three Tuleans left last Friday with Don Elberson, Co-op chief, for the Chicago convention of Sept. 28, 29 and 30.


The three buyers to be selected by the different project representatives in Chicago, will purchase goods for all centers; their salary will be shared by the different projects.

Shigeichi Kubo, "Corky" Kawasaki and Wilbur Takeguchi were the three delegates chosen to re-

company Don Elberson. They will take advantage of their stay in Chicago by making purchases for the local Co-op, and are expected to return on Oct. 10.

### MESS WORKERS MUST HAVE ASSIGNMENT

"Anybody going to work in any mess hall without the proper assignments will not receive any wages, clothing allowances, or any compensation whatsoever until the proper papers have been processed," stated Ralph E. Peck, project steward. "There will not be any exceptions made to this rule."

Mr. Peck has added that from Sept. 25 no assignments was backdated and no persons under 18 years of age is to be employed in the Mess Management Division.

When the next shoe stamp becomes valid, November 1, it will remain in effect until May 1, unless shoe production should exceed present estimates, it was explained.

The reduced civilian shoe ration is necessary, OPA said, because of "heavy drains for military purposes, greatly reduced supplies and manpower shortages."

In addition, OPA announced that shoe stamp No. 13 in ration book No. 1 will not expire October 31, as originally planned, but will be extended indefinitely, to provide an overlap period.

This decision follows an announcement made September 14 during a visit to Portland by W. Stephenson, chief of the OPA shoe rationing division, that provisions to avoid another buying rush at shoe stamp expiration time might be expected.

Charles Mace, Official W.R.A. photographer, arrived at the Tule Lake Center to photograph project scenes and activities. He will leave on the Heart Mountain train on Sept. 30, and document the trip.

**CASH ORDERS**

The Co-op has been cashing all cash orders of only those who were leaving the center. However, hereafter all cash orders will be redeemed at the check-cashing counter, #718-A, for all remaining as well as outgoing.

The cash order may still be used to purchase merchandise at any canteen.

**STORES CLOSE FRI.**

All canteens, service shops, and warehouses will be closed all day on Friday, October 1, 1943 due to taking physical inventory.

**CHECK CASHING**

To avoid inconvenience, delays and confusion at the time of departure from the project, the Co-op management wished to inform all colonists who will be in urgent need of funds to contact their respective banks as soon as possible to have their personal checks certified or changed into "cashier's checks".

Cashier's check or certified checks will be cashed on presentations at the check-cashing counter provided funds are available at that time.

**LAUNDRY SERVICE**

The New City Laundry service will be temporarily terminated.

Those who brought in the laundry previous to temporary termination of the New City Laundry service are requested to call for them by Saturday Oct. 2, 1943, in order to transmit all claims and adjustments.
