## RESTRICTIONS MADE ON GATHERINGS—PEDICORD

It becomes necessary to curtail all activities and gatherings until further notice, according to Dr. Reece Pedicord, chief medical officer of the Base Hospital.

He adds that no children under 12 years of age will be permitted to have gatherings except those that are absolutely necessary; no visitors will be allowed at the Base Hospital.

Dr. Pedicord hopes that these restrictions may be eased on about Oct. 10.

### WILL BE DELAYED DUE TO LACK OF AID ON CONSTRUCTION

"Due to the lack of help and cooperation from the crews constructing the high school, the opening will be delayed indefinitely," warned Martin P. Gunderson, superintendent of schools. Speaking vehemently Gunderson declared that at the rate of work accomplished at the present, the high school may open the following year.

"Everything possible is being done by the education staff to open the doors of the new building to the students on the tentative date of November 1," stated Gunderson.

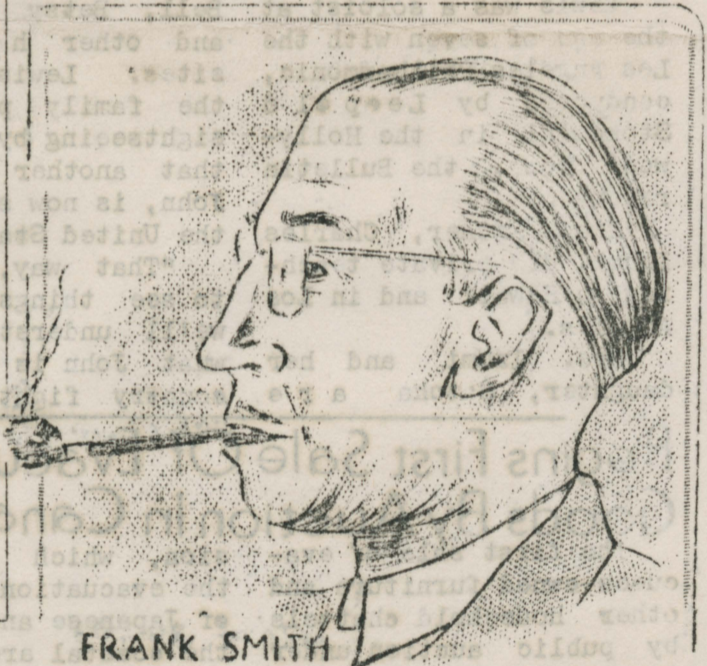

Eleven year old Lewis Izumi is counting on "the international language of music to win friendship" for himself and his family according to a story in the Evening Bulletin.

Lewis is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Izumi, who with another child, Satoka, relocated recently in this city.

He has already attracted attention by his piano playing on the Swarthmore College campus, where his family is now residing. Accustomed to long hours of practice, Lewis plays Bach, Schubert and Beethoven, unaware that audiences gather daily outside the family's home to hear him.

He has been awarded a Curtis Institute scholarship on the recommendation of his teacher, Theodore Saldenberg, formerly accompanist to the school's director.

Lewis was a soloist at the age of seven with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, conducted by Leopold Stokowski in the Hollywood Bowl, the Bulletin reports.

## STORAGE OF EVACUEES IN GOVT. WAREHOUSE STILL HELD

Government warehouses in principal cities on the west coast still bulge with the uncalled-for possessions of the evacuees, who left their homes well over a year ago, according to a report filed by the San Francisco correspondent of the New York Times.

A visit to the San Francisco warehouse showed thousands of articles of household furnishings packed neatly on several

The WRA shipped four carloads of evacuees' effects to them in July and seven in August, and 126 less-than-carload shipments during the two months. It is estimated that as evacuee family averages 1,164 pounds of household possessions and that originally the evacuees had more than 16,000 tons of such goods to be moved or stored. In the last year about 26 per cent. of this has been handled so that the job ahead is still a big one.

## Begins First Sale Of Evacuee Goods By Auction In Canada

The first sale of evacuee-owned furniture and other household chattels by public auction under direction of the Custodian of Japanese property began on Sept. 15, according to Pacific Citizen.

In a statement, F. G. Shears, director of the Custodian's office in Vancouver, B.C. said that depreciation had been high, and for those reasons it was considered desirable to dispose of these goods.

He added that the Custodian has always been prepared to ship chattels, which has been done upon approval of the British Columbia Security Commis-

sion, which carried out the evacuation of persons of Japanese ancestry from the coastal area, and the payment of shipping charges.
