DEATH CLAIMS TWO WRA PERSONNEL

Death struck two tragic blows this week among the appointed personnel of the WRA. Elmer Rowalt, Deputy Director in Washington, died suddenly after a brief illness which had not been regarded as critical. He was 40 years old, a native of Ohio. He had spent the major part of his professional life in Agriculture Administrative work.

Selected by Milton Eisenhower at the beginning of the WRA, Rowalt was made Assistant Director, later Deputy Director of the WRA. Rowalt's integrity, judgement, and administrative ability won him the respect and friendship of all who knew him.

Dying in more tragic circumstances was Harold Dean Emerson, Assistant Project Steward at the Tule Lake Center. He was killed on the night of November 6 when his car collided with a train near the outskirts of Klamath Falls.

Emerson worked at Gila before coming to this center March 5, 1943.

NISEI NEWSMAN VISIT CENTER

Roy Takeno, University of Southern California graduate and former newspaperman, arrived on the project Sunday afternoon with the segregationees from Manzanar. Mr. Takeno is the liaison man between the Assistant Project Director, Bob Brown, and the Reports Office.

Since Mr. Brown's appointment as Assistant Project Director some months ago, Mr. Takeno has been in virtual charge of the Reports Office. He was sent to Tule Lake to study various project activities and to report on the method used here.

Before evacuation Mr. Takeno was editor of the English section of "California Daily News", widely read Japanese American newspaper published in Los Angeles.

Arthur L. Williams, Assistant Chief of Internal Security at Manzanar, was the Project representative on the train. Mr. Williams and Mr. Takeno both lived in Redondo Beach, California, before the war.

Curtailment of public activities was deemed necessary when a minor case of communicable disease was reported a fortnight ago. Since no complica-

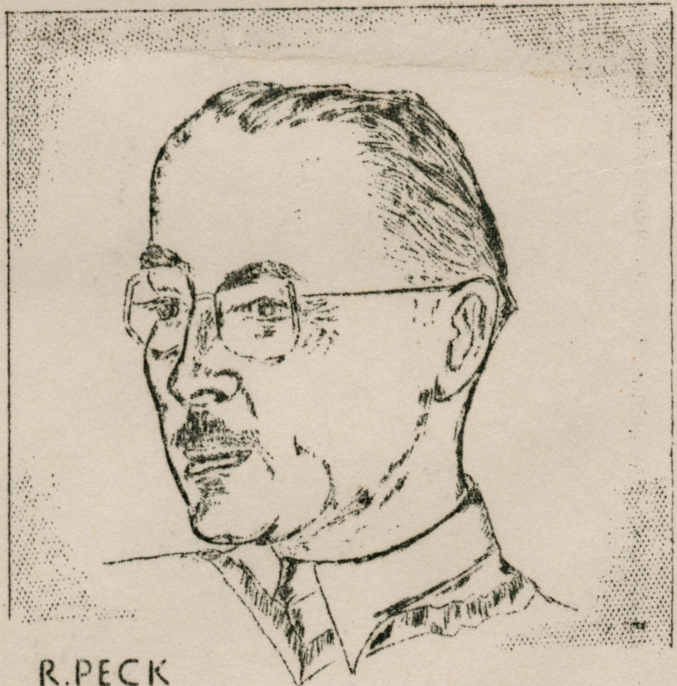

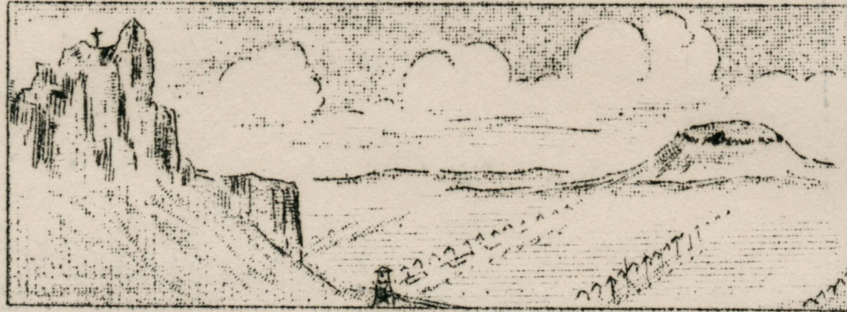
The View From Castle Rock

During the past year hundreds of people have clambered up to the crest of the scenical Castle Rock to look down upon the surroundings of the project area.

The first thing one notices is the huge city of Tule Lake with its numerous, uniform-sized, tarpapered barracks sitting peacefully in the once huge lakebed. Then one will see immediately the lone black smokestack of the base hospital continually belching forth dismal smoke surrounded by the billowy smoke from the various apartments.

As one gradually turns to the northwest, one can see large verdant patches of green vegetables on our large project farm which is being extensively cultivated and irrigated by the colonists. Surrounding the farm, the glistening canals carry the much needed water to the thirsty fields. To the more westward section on the left side of the project farm one will notice the remains of a once fair-sized lake. Now it is only a mere pond constantly being drained to make room for the ever-increasing wheat field.



In the deep southern section one can see the arid region, used only as grazing land. The rolling plain and its brownish prairie grass dotted here and there with sagebrush can be seen for miles and miles. At the more southeastern region where the land is low there is now the remains of the once vast Tule Lake—a sanctuary for wild life.

In the far east one can see the picturesque Abalone Mountain protruding high as the background for the vast wasteland between the camp and the hill. In this huge area an occasional cry of the coyote can be heard reverberating for miles around in the placid atmosphere.

Being a huge lakebed surrounded by high hills, the expanse beyond the few square miles of Tule Lake is obstructed.

With all these various pictures visualized in their minds sightseers descend from the steep Castle Rock satisfied with the knowledge that they had seen the area surrounding their home.

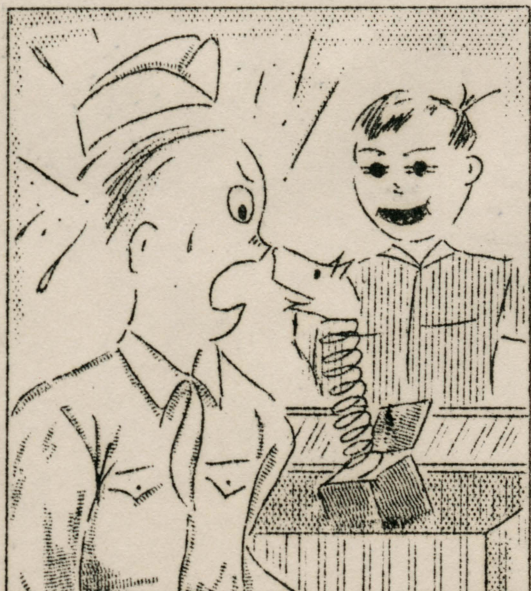
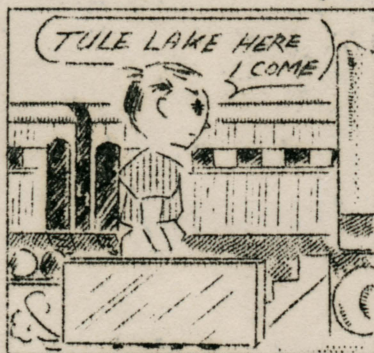
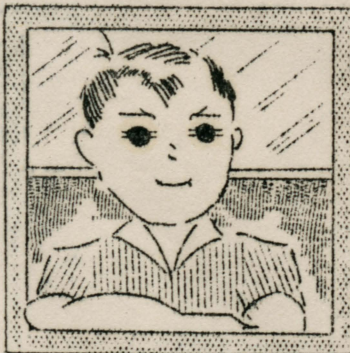

As your Dispatch reporter entered the Co-op library, which is adjacent to the Co-op office at 717-A, he was shown around by Miss Asako Higashi, librarian.

A list on the wall revealed that "None But the Lonely Heart" by Richard Llewellyn, "Burma Surgeon" by Gordon S. Seagrave, M. D., are the latest additions to the ever-increasing number of books. Other books which have been added recently are "Queens Die Proudly" by W.L. White, "Lou Gehrig Pride of the Yankees" by Paul Gallico, and "They were Expendable" by W.L. White. There are many other best-sellers awaiting book lovers.

For those desiring to learn or brush up on the Japanese language, there are two books entitled "Elementary Japanese," published by the Harvard University Press in 1942. There are also English-Japanese and Japanese-English dictionaries available. Three English-Japanese dictionaries are awaiting prospective buyers.

The excellent results one can get from the Tulean Dispatch lost and found department was demonstrated recently when a valuable wrist watch was found after two hours following the announcement of the loss.

While on her best Faye Sakata, former reporter from Jerome, picked up a shining object lying in the dust by the road side. Upon closer examination Faye discovered that it was a valuable Swiss timepiece. Only two hours before she reported the find to the Dispatch office, the owner had sadly announced the loss to the lost and found editor.

Faye donated the reward of \$5.00 to the Tulean Dispatch Emergency fund.

President Roosevelt assured that evacuees will eventually be permitted to return to the Pacific coast in a letter accompanying the WRA's report to the Senate at the start of segregation. Stating that the great majority of persons of Japanese ancestry in America are loyal to the democratic institutions of the United States, President Roosevelt specified that: "We shall restore to the loyal evacuees the right to return to the evacuated areas as soon as the military situation will make such restoration feasible."

Concluding, the Utah Nippo also reported that Lt. Gen. Delos C. Emmons who succeeded Lt. Gen. John L. DeWitt as commanding general of the western defense command and Fourth Army indicated no change was contemplated in Army policy regarding the exclusion orders.

Effective Sept. 28, all visits to Granada have been curtailed until the danger of polio has passed, according to W. Ray Johnson, Assistant Project Director.

"We did not like to issue such an order but it was done to safeguard the health and lives of the residents," said Johnson.

According to Dr. W. T. Carstarphen, chief medical officer, there have been no new cases of infantile paralysis in the

center aside from the two cases previously reported. However, he states that the quarantine will be kept up very rigidly for a week or so.

Fifty-seven former Tule Lake residents sent to Jerome as a part of the segregation program were transferred to Rohwer on Sept. 28.

The latest additions were reassigned to Rohwer upon request of ex-Tuleans who wished to be near their relatives or friends. Rohwer population now stands at 6708, according to the Rohwer Outpost.

Present indications show that other such transfers may be forthcoming within the next month or so.

MANZANAR FREE PRESS

FOOD NOW BEING PROCESSED

Although dehydration equipment has not been fully assembled, the food dehydration unit has started operation in a limited way, according to the Industrial Division in Manzanar.

6000 pounds of turnips, 5000 pounds of Italian squash and 4500 pounds of green tomatoes have been processed to date.

Surplus foods are washed thoroughly, sliced, and placed on layers of trays. They are then subject to blanching or bleaching and placed in a dehydration room for about six to ten hours. The temperature of the room is from 140 degrees to 170 degrees. The products are then packed and stored for winter use.
