## Strict Penalties For Violators of Speed Laws

To avoid accidents Internal Security stated that all vehicle operators must drive with extreme care. Driving regulations must be strictly observed.

The speed limit for driving on the ward boundary roads is 20 m.p.h. and between the blocks 12 m.p.h. Within the blocks only motor vehicle with special permit is allowed and slow driving is necessary. All law breakers will be

## FARM ACCIDENT IS FATAL TO TOPAZAN

As a result of injuries sustained in the hospital Friday's farm truck accident, Tatsuto Kashima, 53, died yesterday morning at the base hospital. The former San Francisco, who had recently arrived from Topaz, Utah, died of pneumonia which set in following serious chest injuries received in the mishap. He is survived by his wife, Taki, and son Haki Kazunori.

A total of 12 Tuleans were hospitalized and 17 others were treated for cuts and abrasions

on Friday afternoon staff had the busiest day of the local hospital's history.

Four residents, Toshi Yamada, Kensaburo Sawada, Tom Naka, and Takeshi Takagi, are still in a critical condition because of numerous injuries received in the accident. However, they are reported to be improving. Seven other occupants of the ill-fated truck who are also in the hospital will be released in a few days.

Johnny Nomura, the only victim of the fire truck accident of Wednesday afternoon who is still in the hospital, was reported to be in a semi-coma, yesterday. His condition has not improved

## HAROLD S. JACOBY INTERNAL SECURITY

Arriving on the Center May 18, 1942, before the first evacuees arrived ten days later, Dr. Harold S. Jacoby has been the first and only Chief of Internal Security up to this time. Among his first duties, Dr. Jacoby formed the Wardens organization and looked after the Social Welfare department. In August, 1942, the Social Welfare became a separate unit. The Fire Department was then transferred to his supervision. Dr. Jacoby resigned his position recently, and left the center Saturday. He plans a vacation with his parents in Oakland before going to his new position.

## Frost Inflicts Damage On Farm Crops

"Huge loss was inflicted upon the project farm by the severe frost which struck last Tuesday morning, Oct. 12th. The damage done is not as yet estimated, but the loss is tremendously great," announced C.R. Kallam, agriculture chief.

The products which were almost completely wiped out included nappa, endive, Swiss chard, lettuce and the dry onions were in very poor condition.

Potatoes, cauliflower, broccoli, cabbage, turnips and carrots remained unharmed.

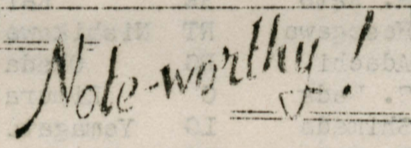

## License... Granted to Colorado Nisei

The first license to a Japanese American evacuee to practice medicine in Colorado was granted yesterday by the State Board of Medical Examiners to Dr. Howard Suenaga of Denver, formerly of Guadalupe, California.

Dr. Suenaga, 34, is a graduate of Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia. He was born in Hawaii, as were his parents, and is residing with his wife in Denver.

When the evacuation of West Coast was ordered, he was placed in charge of the hospital at the Tulare Assembly Center, under orders of the U.S. Department of Health, and later at the request of the War Relocation Authority, he was transferred to the Heart Mountain Relocation Center, so that his skill in surgery could be utilized.

## JAPAN...

...fights for Asia! Thus the San Francisco Examiner headlined their editorial of the October 13th issue. In an effort to awaken the American public to the fact that Japan is enemy no. 1, the Hearst paper published an editorial based on John Goette's book, "Japan Fights for Asia", in which he exposes Japan's real role in this war.

## FIGHTING...

...to unite all of Asia, Japan is the mouthpiece and sword of over a billion people, not including Russia, with whom she has an alliance! Putting these words in the opening lines, the editorial continued with excerpts from an interview with John Goette who said: "The Japs are going ahead fast to make themselves stronger in occupied lands because they intend to stay...In occupied North China the Japanese are now busily engaged in a four-year plan to raise its total coal production to 44,400,000 tons. They also are putting into effect a five year plan for an annual iron output of 2,150,000 tons in that area. Steel plants have been reorganized with a hope of 500,000 tons annually...Japan as she stands now is potentially the richest empire on earth in the availability of raw materials."

## WARNING...

...against the growing might of Nippon, the paper came out with the following lines: "We are paying too much attention to Marshal Stalin and not enough to General MacArthur...Which man do you think, Americans, is more important to our future--the dictator in the Kremlin or our great general in the Pacific?"

## REALIZING...

...that Japan was not to be beaten in a few months, America is preparing herself to fight an enemy and gone is the overconfident spirit of the post-Pearl Harbor days.....TO

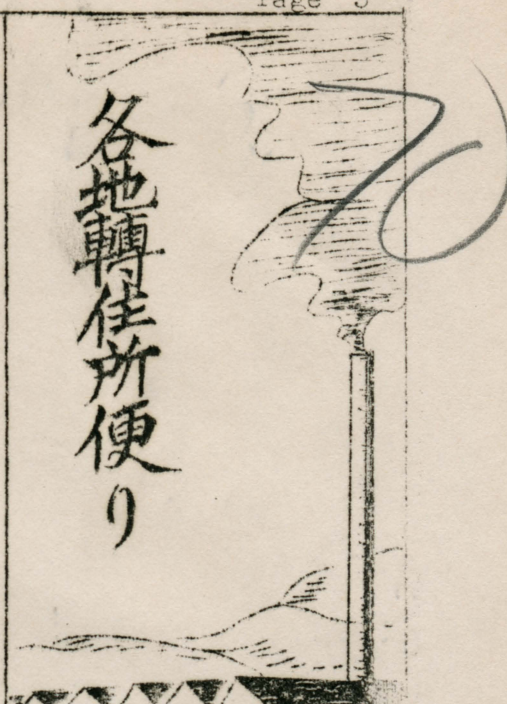
