WORKERS WRA To Construct Ten Blocks

MUST HAVE ASSIGNMENT

Workers must have assignment before entering on duty, because in the future no assignment will be backdated warned Frank D. Fagan, who complained of many workers commencing their work without assignment papers and then requesting the placement division to backdate their assignment.

"For the benefit of the newcomers to the Tule Lake project, I wish to again state that no person should begin working in any office or any job without an assignment from the Placement office," said Fagan.

"Failure to secure proper assignment means that the time put in prior to the date of requesting assignment will be lost by the evacuee, as all future assignments will not be backdated," he warned.

OCCUPANTS OF TWENTY-ONE BARRACKS TO MOVE

Residents are advised not to make permanent alterations or constructions in their apartments.

As soon as new blocks are built, it is expected that it will be necessary to move the occupants of 21 barracks. This will be necessary in order to establish elementary schools. It is impossible at this time to announce the location of the schools because this will be determined by the concentration of elementary school children. A study of this is being made at the present time.

As soon as the location of the schools is known, a public announcement will be made, so that the residents of the barracks to be used for school may be advised.

MILLION DOLLAR PROJECT TO BE COMPLETED IN TWO MONTHS

Initial work for the building of additional housing for the local residents has started at the eastern end of the present camp adjacent to "Alaska". The million dollar contract calling for the construction of barracks similar but slightly larger than the present houses was awarded to a construction firm, who will finish the project by the first of the year.

To cope with the necessities of the five thousand residents who are expected to be moved here, the plans call for the construction of additional water storage tank and sewage disposal facilities at the eastern end of the camp.

The project will be built by the Morrison-Knudsen and Ford J. Twait on a joint job.

FIVE JAPANESE WOMEN HELD BY FBI

Five Japanese women were taken into custody on Oct. 27 at Trinidad, Colorado for investigation stemming from the discovery of pictures which showed Japanese women in the embrace of German prisoners of war, six of whom recently escaped from a nearby internment camp, according to the S.F. Examiner.

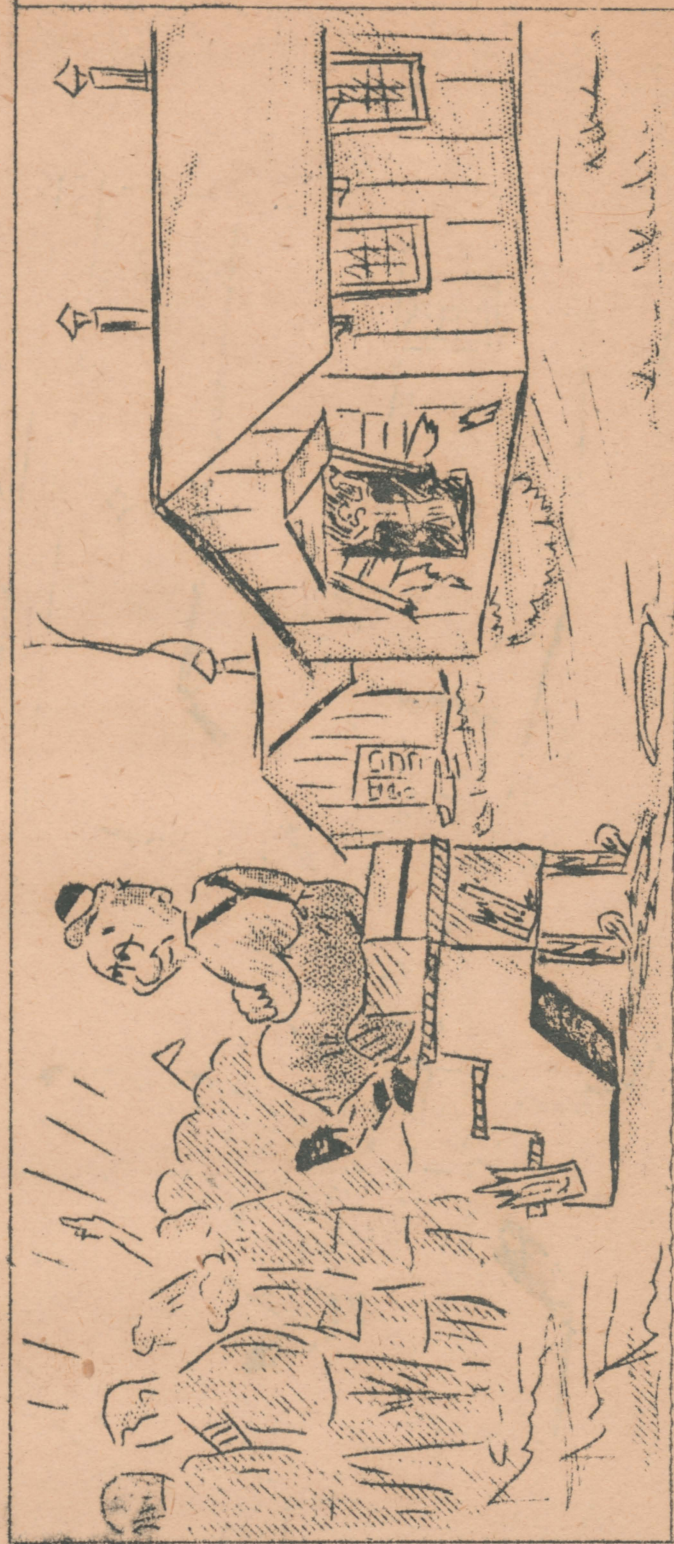
Publication in the Denver Post of three snapshots discovered when one of the escaped prisoners was captured probably led to an investigation of the matter. The three pictures showed one escaped Nazi prisoner and two other unidentified men in the arms of Japanese women.

The women were taken into custody by FBI agents at a farm where Japanese Americans from the Granada center are employed on a seasonal leave.

Impartial View Of Japanese Problem Sought In Survey

Conducting a survey of the sentiment of the government officials and California congressmen towards the Japanese American, Mrs. Ruth W. Kingman, executive secretary of the Pacific Coast Committee on American Principles and Fair Play, said that she is seeking an impartial view of the Japanese picture in the United States, according to a recent article in the Pacific Citizen.

She described the committee, which includes many prominent California educators, as a fact-finding group interested in providing an objective approach to the Japanese problem.

"We are interested in presenting a fair picture of the problem to prevent unjust prejudice being built up against Japanese which would prevent many from assuming their rightful position as American citizens when war conditions permit their return to their West Coast homes," stated Mrs. Kingman, as she explained that this committee had never advocated the return of the Japanese to the Pacific Coast until the War Department had deemed such a move feasible.

survey, she interviewed Attorney General Francis Biddle, who expressed his determination that the constitutional rights of law-abiding persons, regardless of their ancestry, shall be maintained.

The following Tulelake Basketball Rules were compiled by Masao Nakashima, basketball commissioner.

1. The name of the league will be the Tule Lake Class A and Class B.

a. Class A----unlimited.

b. Class B----for those players who are not of Class A caliber.

2. Players may play on one and only one team.

3. Players list may be increased but no players may be added who previously has played in any other team in the same league.

a. Class A and B leagues.

1. Additional players are not eligible until 7 days have elapsed after their names have been added to the roster at the Recreation Center.
