Dr. Thompson's visit to the Project accomplished several things. addressed vericus groups of the hospital staff ineluding doctors, dentists, nurses as well as holding meetings with hospital and health dept. person-

Dr. Thompson pointed aut that the situation here was no different, in fact in many instances much better than conditions found in many commurities throughout United States.

Dr. Carson, chief modical officer, stated that it was evident from Dr. Thompson's statements that some changes in personnel of the hospital will be necessary.
