A report being circulated here that there is a bill before Congress designed to deprive the Japanese-American citizens of their constitutional rights of franchise was definitely stated to be erroneous, according to a telegram received last night by the administra-tion from Ernest Besig, attorney of American Civil Liberties Union in San Francisco.

An inquiry in reference to this matter was made by the administration when it was reported that a bill to take away citizenship from the nisei had already passed the House of Representatives and was favorably reported by a Senate committee. This report came as a shock last week to many of Tule Lake restdents, who have been without adequate means of communications with the outside world for past several months.

The telegram by Attorney Besig stated as follows:

"REPORT ERRONEOUS. NO HOUSE ACTION. INTERNMENT BILL FAVORABLY REPORTED BY SENATE COMMITTEE."


