CARDINALS TAME BRONCOS 5 - 0 TO NAB LEAGUE LEAD

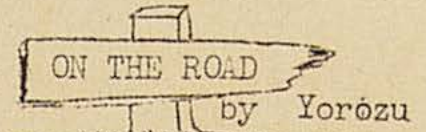
