Railroad Company Seeks 180 Workers

The Northern Pacific Railroad company is seeking two crews of 80 men each for work in Western Montana, Idaho and Eastern Washington.

O. H. Underwood, representative, revealed that wages have been raised from 52 cents to 56 cents an hour for eight hours a day and time and a half after nine hours. Each worker will be charged \$8.75 per week for subsistence.

Cooks are also needed by the company, according to Underwood. Wages for first cook ranges from \$150-\$175 per month. The second cook will be paid between \$110-\$120, and not less than \$75 will be paid to the five men employed as cooks' helpers.
