Japanese Language Instructors Wanted by Universities

Six Japanese-speaking nisei to serve as teaching assistants in various institutions including Yale University are urgently needed, according to J. M. Cowan, director of the Intensive Language Program of the American Council of Learned Societies. Persons selected will assist in training American soldiers under the Army Specialized Training program.

An initial offer of \$150 per month plus travel expenses to Yale University is now being made by the society. This salary would hold during the training period and if the candidates prove themselves adept, their compensations would be made comparable to that now received by two other such trained persons who have been placed on the staff at Yale University at \$2,200 a year.

In revealing the Cowan's offer, Joe Carroll, employment chief, declared that this is one of the finest opportunities made available to the nisei. Alert college graduates who speak both English and Japanese, preferably not over 25 years of age are considered ideal, and although women can be used, Cowan has expressed preference for men, Carroll said.

Candidates need have no previous teaching experience; in fact too much experience with the usual pedagogical procedures might interfere with the adaptation to the new system, Cowan implied. He pointed out that for these positions the important factors are fluency in speaking the standard Tokyo dialect of the Japanese language, education, and personality. Reading and writing ability in the Japanese language, while desirable, is by no means essential, in Cowan's opinion.

In urging residents who believe they are qualified to leave their names at the outside employment office, Carroll declared that in addition to being assured permanent positions in the academic profession, candidates will have an opportunity to pursue any independent study which they might be interested in taking at Yale University or at any institution to which they may later be assigned.

Urge Residents to Put Return Addresses on Outgoing Mail

Residents were urged again this week to place return addresses on all matter being mailed out. Pete Fujioka, post office supervisor, also reminded residents that Sentinels require one and a half cents postage for mailing anywhere in the United States, with or without the Japanese sections.

Two Sentinels require three cents postage. Fujioka reported that 30 to 40 Sentinels are held up each week because of insufficient postage. In cases where there is no return address the paper has to be destroyed as there is no way to check the sender, he said. Fujioka warned residents that chain letters are illegal.

Changes in YWCA Conference Program Announced

Changes in the YWCA conference program were announced today by Louise Suski, chairman. Because nine representatives of the Billings YWCA will arrive here Friday noon and expect to leave Saturday noon, the installation and initiation ceremony planned for Saturday night was moved up to Friday night. The tea for the visitors will be held at 2:30 p.m. Friday at the USO lounge with the ceremony opening at 7 p.m.
