

Self-government Charter Approved by Project Director

The charter for community government for Heart Mountain relocation center has been approved by the project director and plans are now being laid for presenting the document to the community for ratification.

Complete Japanese and English texts of the charter will be mimeographed and distributed to individual apartments this week.

Block meeting of July 5 will be devoted mainly to presentation and discussion of the proposed charter.

Date for a center-wide vote on ratification of the charter has been tentatively set for Wednesday, July 7.

Appeal for Aid in Unloading Coal Again Made

A few days ago a call was made for help in unloading coal. There has been little or no response to this call. As a result, we still have at least 20 cars of coal on which we are paying demurrage and which are being held out of vital transportation service. At the present time it is absolutely necessary that every available railroad car be utilized to the maximum. If we at Heart Mountain do not cooperate by releasing cars promptly, our failure to cooperate with the mines and with the Office of Defense Transportation may result in our not being able to get cars at a time when our need may be critical.

Therefore, the call is made again for at least 20 good able-bodied men to shovel coal for a few days. With concerted effort of this many additional men, the coal could be unloaded in just three or four days. Any man who are willing to assist in unloading coal should report to the Employment Office.
